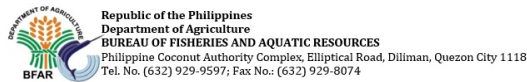

Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors this week:

- Compared to previous weeks, larger volumes of small- and medium-sized Local-fresh Galunggong were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. More specifically, a total of 4,936 tubs of Local-fresh Galunggong were unloaded on Mar. 16 and 19. The limited and unpredictable availability of Local-fresh Galunggong, among other fresh marine commodities (i.e., Dalagang Bukid, Gulyasan, Turay, Tamban), may still be effects of the strong winds brought by the Northeast Monsoon or *Hanging Amihan*, which hampered fishing operations in major fishing grounds.
- Despite the abundance of its local variant, Imported-frozen Galunggong continues to be available at Navotas Fish Port as an alternative commodity. Relative to this, the prevailing price of Imported-frozen Galunggong is unstable and dependent on the availability of fresh marine commodities.
- Meanwhile, aquacultured commodities (particularly Tilapia, Bangus, and Hipon) were noted to have sufficient availability coming from major source areas. Prices of these commodities were dependent on the size and volume of unloadings.
- Major source areas of the top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are as follows:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local Galunggong - Palawan
- Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to implement precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 at the Navotas Fish Port Complex. Among these measures are mandatory wearing of face masks, face shields, white shirt, and white boots; and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection.
