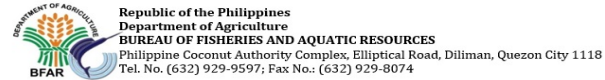

<p>The following observations were gathered from market vendors and administrators for the month of March:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Fresh marine commodities, especially small-sized Local-fresh Galunggong, were noted to have stable availability in the monitored retail markets this month. However, prevailing retail price of the commodity still vary depending on the wholesale prices and source areas in major fish ports. 2. Despite the availability of its local variant, Imported-frozen Galunggong remains available in the monitored retail markets as an alternative commodity to Local-fresh Galunggong. However, it was noted that most vendors still prefer selling Local-fresh Galunggong over the imported commodity as it is usually more preferred by consumers. 3. Bangus and Tilapia, among other aquacultured commodities, was noted to have ample availability and stable prices throughout the monitored retail markets.

Remarks/Market Observations:	<p>4. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets were sourced mainly from the following:</p> <p>a. Bangus - Bulacan b. Tilapia - Batangas c. Local-fresh Galunggong - Malabon Fish Port (Lucena, Quezon) & Navotas Fish Port (Palawan) d. Imported-frozen Galunggong - Navotas Fish Port e. Alumahan - Malabon Fish Port</p> <p>5. "Matumal na bentahan" or low demand from buyers was apparent among the monitored markets throughout the month. As a result, some vendors are opting to:</p> <p>a. Open their fish stalls on selected days of the week only, or during on weekends where there is higher influx of people; b. Offer remaining unsold stocks from previous day at a lower price to avoid further loss of sales; or c. Sell only limited volumes of fishery commodities to ensure that all supplies are sold out by the end.</p> <p>6. Due to the surge of COVID-19 cases in Metro Manila, NCR Plus (inc. Bulacan, Laguna, and Rizal) will be placed under Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) from Mar. 29 - Apr. 3. Relative to this, market administrators have ensured more stringent observance of precautionary measures in accordance with ECQ protocols. Among these measures were wearing of face masks and face shields, mandatory temperature checks, "One Entry, One Exit" policy and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection.</p> <p>7. Physical monitoring activities by FIDSSD-CO in the eleven (11) retail markets are temporarily suspended beginning March 23. Price data and relevant market observations were obtained through close coordination with the vendors and market personnel. Resumption of physical price monitoring activities will be subject to risk assessment with the top management and the decline of COVID-19 cases to a "tolerable level" in Metro Manila.</p>
