**Remarks/Market Observations:**

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Sufficient volumes of fresh marine commodities, mainly from Northern Palawan, were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) on 4 May 2021. For Local-fresh Galunggong, available supplies on the said date were medium to large in size and unloaded by two (2) companies only.
- Despite the sufficient availability of its local variant, minimal volumes of Imported-frozen Galunggong male variant (*Decapterus macrosoma*) were still noted on 4 May 2021. Meanwhile, no Imported-frozen Galunggong female variant (*Decapterus russelli*) was noted throughout the week.
- Meanwhile, ample supplies of Bangus and Tilapia from major source areas were available at the fish port on 4 May 2021. Majority of the available Bangus supplies are relatively large in size at 2-3 pcs/kg.
- Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Laguna, Bulacan, Pangasinan
  - Tilapia - Batangas
  - Imported-frozen Galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Precautionary measures (e.g. wearing of face mask and face shields as well as white boots and white shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at the Navotas Fish Port Complex to protect the vendors and buyers against COVID-19.
- No wholesale price data, volume, and market observations on the unloadings of fresh fishery commodities provided by PFDA on 7 May 2021 due to the centralization of wholesale price data reporting of fishery commodities per telecon advice from Ms. Pinky Aguila, Fishery Market Operations Officer III at PFDA.
