**Remarks/Market Observations:**

**The following observations were gathered from market personnel:**

- Abundant unloadings of fresh marine commodities, especially local-fresh Galunggong (*Decapterus macrosoma*), were observed at the Navotas Fish Port this week. This resulted to a decreased in the prevailing wholesale price this week at Php120.00/kg.
- Imported-frozen Galunggong "lalaki" continues to have available supply at the Navotas Fish Port despite the abundance of its local variant. There is still no Imported-frozen Galunggong "Babae" being sold at the fish port.
- No changes in the prevailing wholesale prices of Bangus and Tilapia due to the steady supplies at the Navotas Fish Port.
- Other fishery commodities like dalagang bukid, salinyasi, betilya, lapu-lapu, tulingan, tamban, gulyasan, pusit, hipon were also noted to have abundant supplies at the Navotas Fish Port this week.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
  - Tilapia - Batangas
  - Local galunggong- North Palawan
  - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask and face shields as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.
