<b>Remarks/Market Observations:</b>			<p>The following observations were gathered from market personnel and administrators:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Aquacultured commodities, such as Bangus and Tilapia, continue to be have sufficient unloadings at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale).</li> <li>2. Fresh marine commodities, on the other hand, continue to have unpredictable unloadings from major fishing grounds due to the recent lifting of the Closed Fishing Season (CFS) and the cold weather condition brought by the Northeast Monsoon or <i>Hanging Amihan</i>. As a result, only small-sized Local-fresh Galunggong, Tunsoy and Gulyasan were observed at the fish port.</li> <li>3. Imported-frozen Galunggong continue to be available at the fish port as an alternative to its local variant.</li> <li>4. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan</li> <li>b. Tilapia - Batangas</li> <li>c. Imported-frozen Galunggong - China, Vietnam</li> </ol> </li> <li>5. Precautionary safety measures are still implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) to ensure that vendors and buyers are protected from the COVID-19 virus.</li> </ol>
