<b>Remarks/Market Observations:</b>		<p>The following observations were gathered from market personnel and administrators:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. No Local-fresh galunggong and Alumahan were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) throughout the week. The unavailability of the said fresh marine commodities may be attributed to the Closed Fishing Season (CFS) for pelagic fishes in Northeastern Palawan and Visayan Sea. In addition, the cold weather condition also contributes to the low volume of catch as it drives fishes to the bottom of the ocean, making them harder to catch.</li> <li>2. Supplies of aquacultured commodities, particularly Bangus and Tilapia continue to be sufficient at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale).</li> <li>3. Meanwhile, ample volumes of Imported-frozen Galunggong are available at the fish port, resulting to the commodity's stable wholesale price.</li> <li>4. Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:                         <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Bangus - Pangasinan</li> <li>b. Tilapia - Batangas</li> <li>c. Imported Galunggong - China, Vietnam</li> </ol> </li> <li>5. Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continuously ensures the implementation of precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 at the Navotas Fish Port. These measures include wearing of face masks and face shields, mandatory temperature checks and hand disinfection as well as regular clean-up and disinfection.</li> </ol>
