Remarks/Market Observations

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and administrators this week:

- Throughout the week, no Local-fresh Galunggong and Alumahan were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale). The unavailability of the said fresh marine commodities, among others, may still be attributed to the implementation of Closed Fishing Season (CFS) for pelagic fishes in Visayan Sea and continuous occurrence of Northeast Monsoon or "Hanging Amihan." In addition, the cold weather condition also contributes to the low volume of catch as it drives fishes to the bottom of the ocean, making them harder to catch.
- On the other hand, supplies of aquacultured commodities, including Bangus and Tilapia, continue to have sufficient displays at the monitored markets due to the ample unloading from major source areas.
- Similarly, there continues to be sufficient volumes of Imported-frozen Galunggong available at the fish port.
- Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) is continuously implementing the precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 (e.g temperature check at the entrance, mandatory wearing of face masks and face shields, and observance of social distancing, etc.) at the Navotas Fish Port.
