Remarks/Market Observations:			<p>The Department of Agriculture has declared fish from Taal Lake safe to eat amid the Taal Volcano eruption. The announcement came after BFAR conducted laboratory analyses for water and fish samples in the lake. Consumption, per the announcement, must be confined to those that are fresh and caught alive. Caught fish must also be washed thoroughly, internal organs removed, and cooked properly."</p> <p>Sources: (1) Department of Agriculture - DRRM Operations Center, 19 January 2020, Retrieved from: https://www.facebook.com/dadrrmopcen/posts/537853310155338 (2) Franco L., Philstar, 20 January 2020, Retrieved from: https://www.philstar.com/headlines/2020/01/20/1986340/fish-taal-lake-safe-consumption-after-all-bfar</p> <p>The following observations were gathered during the actual price monitoring activities this week (January 20-24, 2020):</p> <p>* Despite the issuance of the Department of Agriculture that the fishes from Taal Lake are safe for human consumption, consumers are still afraid to buy fishery commodities from Batangas resulting to a lower demand (i.e., matumal ang bentahan).</p> <p>*The supply of Tilapia remain low at the Navotas Fish Port due to the unavailability of supply from Batangas, which is one of its major source areas, brought by the effect of the ash fall caused by the phreatic eruption of Taal Volcano. Based on the feedback of the enumerator, the only available supply of the said commodity are from Pampanga and Laguna.</p> <p>*There is an observed decrease in the supply of Bangus due to the absence of supply from Batangas. However, the price and supply of the said commodity remain stable due to the enough supply at the fish port.</p> <p>*Majority of the supply of marine fishes, including local Galunggong "Lalaki" (<i>Decapterus macrosoma</i>), are still very low at the Navotas Fish Port. No price data was gathered for local Galunggong "lalaki" because the supply is being sold mixed with other marine fishes. However, there is an observed large supply of small-sized Tulingan (<i>Auxis rochei</i>) in the said fish port.</p> <p>The low supply of marine fishes may be associated to the low volume of unloading at major fish ports caused by:</p> <p>(a) the cold weather brought by Hanging Amihan, wherein the marine fishes normally stay on the bottom of the ocean; (b) the lean season for the said commodities; and (d) the implementation of fishing bans for some marine fishes including local Galunggong (<i>Decapterus spp.</i>) in the Northern part of Palawan (per JAO No. 01 series of 2015), for Sardines, Herrings (<i>Sardinella spp.</i>), and Mackerels (<i>Rastrilliger spp.</i>) in some parts of the Visayan (per Fisheries Administrative Order No. 167-3Series of 2013), and for Sardines in some parts of Zamboanga Sea (per BFAR Administrative Circular 255).</p> <p>*A large supply of frozen/imported commodities was observed at the Fish Port, majority of which are squid, salmon head, and Galunggong.</p>
