**All types of shellfish and *Acetes sp.* or alamang gathered from the area shown above are NOT SAFE for human consumption.** Fish, squids, shrimps and crabs are safe for human consumption provided that they are fresh and washed thoroughly, and internal organs such as gills and intestines are removed before cooking.

The following areas continue to be **FREE from toxic red tides**: coastal waters of Cavite, Las Piñas, Parañaque, Navotas and Bulacan in Manila Bay; coastal waters of Bolinao, Anda, Alaminos, Sual and Wawa, Bani in Pangasinan; Masinloc Bay in Zambales; coastal waters of Milagros and Placer in Masbate; Juag Lagoon, Matnog and Sorsogon Bay in Sorsogon; Puerto Princesa Bay, Puerto Princesa City in Palawan; coastal waters of Gigantes Islands, Carles in Iloilo; coastal waters of Pilar, Panay, President Roxas, Roxas City in Capiz and Sapián Bay (Ivisan and Sapián in Capiz; Mambuquiáo and Camanci in Batán, Aklan); Batán Bay and coastal waters of Altavas and New Washington in Aklan; coastal waters of E.B. Magalona, Talisay City, Silay City, Bacolod City, Hinigaran and Victorias City in Negros Occidental; Tambobo and Siit Bays, Siaton and Bais Bay, Bais City in Negros Oriental; coastal waters of Daus and Tagbilaran City in Bohol; San Pedro and Cancabato Bays, Tacloban City and coastal waters of Calubian and Leyte in Leyte; coastal waters of Biliran Province; Dumanquillas Bay in Zamboanga del Sur; Tantanang Bay in Zamboanga Sibugay; Murcielagos Bay in Zamboanga del Norte and Misamis Occidental; Taguines Lagoon, Benoni, Mahinog in Camiguín Island; Balite Bay, Mati in Davao Oriental; and Hinatuan and Bislig Bays in Surigao del Sur. **Moreover, Coastal waters of Inner Malampaya Sound, Taytay in Palawan is now free of the toxic red tides.**

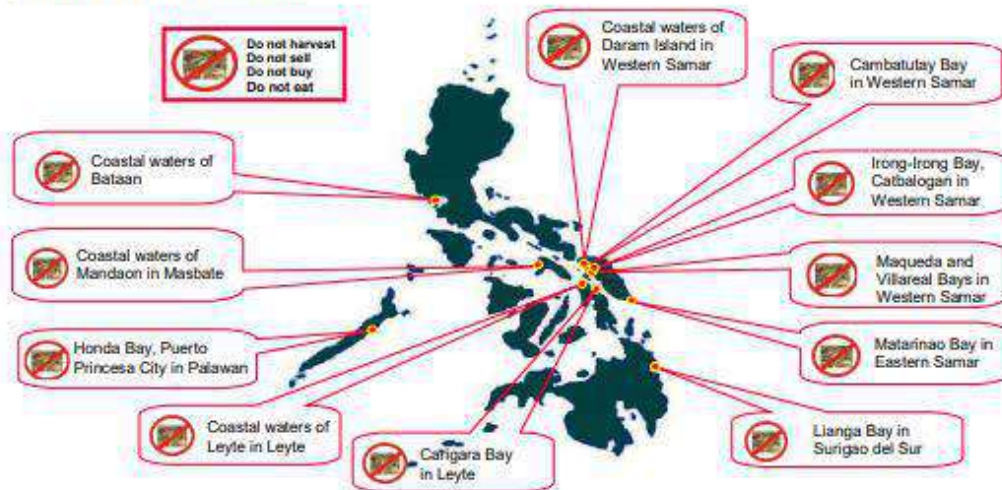

Based on the latest laboratory results of the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) and Local Government Units (LGUs), shellfishes collected at **Coastal waters of Daram Island, Cambatutay, Irong-Irong, Maqueda and Villareal Bays in Western Samar; Matarinao Bay in Eastern Samar; Carigara Bay in Leyte; Lianga Bay in Surigao del Sur; Honda Bay, Puerto Princesa City in Palawan; Coastal waters of Mandaon in Masbate; and Coastal waters of Bataan (Mariveles, Limay, Orion, Pilar, Balanga, Orani, Abucay and Samal)** are still **positive** for paralytic shellfish poison that is beyond the regulatory limit. **Moreover, Coastal waters of Leyte in Leyte is now positive for red tide toxin.**
