Remarks/Market Observations:	<p>*The implementation of Closed Fishing Season for Sardines, Herrings (<i>Sardinella</i> spp.), and Mackerels (<i>Rastrelliger</i> spp.) in some parts of the Visayan Sea begun last November 15, 2019 as stated in Fisheries Administrative Order No. 167-3 Series of 2013.</p> <p>*Based on the team's actual price monitoring, the supply of some seaweeds and marine fishes, including local Galunggong, remain low in all the monitored retail markets. Per market vendors, this may be associated to the low volume of catch caused by: (1) the cold weather brought by the Northeast wind "Hanging Amihan", where marine fishes normally stay at the bottom of the ocean, (2) the rainy weather brought by typhoon "Quiel" and tropical storm "Ramon," which urged some fisherfolk to halt their fishing operations, (3) the occurrence of full moon last (November 12), where the bright moonlight causes the marine fish to scatter, making them difficult to catch (4) the lean season for some marine fishes, and (5) the implementation of the Closed Fishing Season for Galunggong in Northern Palawan, which cover 92% of the landed catch at the Navotas Fish Port (per JAO No. 01 series of 2015) alongside the aforementioned fishing ban in some part of Visayan Sea.</p> <p>*The above observations also caused an increase in the wholesale price of some fresh marine fishes, urging some retail vendors to: (1) also increase their selling price, (2) lessen their supply for selling, and (3) sell other species of Galunggong such as "Burot" (<i>Decapterus kurroides</i>) and "Balsa" (<i>Decapterus macarellus</i>) as well as frozen/imported fishery commodities such as <i>Axius</i> spp., and <i>Decapterus</i> spp. instead.</p> <p>*Meanwhile, the supply of Bangus and Tilapia remain stable in all the monitored retail markets. However, it was noted that some wholesale suppliers are selling their supply at a higher price. According to interviews, this may be attributed to the nearing of the Christmas holidays.</p> <p>*It was also observed that there is a lesser variety of fish available at the monitored markets this week is lesser as compared to the weekly price data last month (October 2019).</p> <p>*Some markets vendors are selling live Tilapia at Php20.00/kg higher than fresh-chilled Tilapia.</p> <p>*The supply of Bangus, Tilapia, and local Galunggong are being sold in mixed sizes in some of the monitored retail markets.</p> <p>*There were recorded feedbacks from some market vendors at the Commonwealth, Navotas, Kamuning, Galas, Mega Q, and Quinta Markets that despite the nearing of Christmas holidays, the demand for fishery commodities remain low (i.e., matumal ang bentahan), urging retailers from their respective markets to lower their selling price (i.e., bagsak presyo) just to get back their capital.</p>
