Remarks/Market Observations:	<p>The following observations were gathered during the actual price monitoring activities this week (December 9-13, 2019):</p> <p>*The supply of marine fishes remain low this week due to the low volume of catch caused by: (1) the occurrence of full moon last December 12, wherein the bright moon light causes marine fishes to scatter, making them difficult to catch, (2) the lean season for the said commodities, (3) the cold weather brought by Hanging Amihan, wherein the marine fishes normally stay on the bottom of the ocean, and (4) the implementation of fishing bans for some marine fishes including local Galunggong (<i>Decapterus spp.</i>) in the Northern part of Palawan (per JAO No. 01 series of 2015), for Sardines, Herrings (<i>Sardinella spp.</i>), and Mackerels (<i>Rastrilliger spp.</i>) in some parts of the Visayan (per Fisheries Administrative Order No. 167-3 Series of 2013), and the fishing ban for Sardines in some parts of Zamboanga Sea (per BFAR Administrative Circular 255).</p> <p>* Based on observations, majority of the frozen/imported commodities at the fish port are squids and salmon heads, while the supply of frozen/imported Galunggong was noted to have decreased. The low supply might have contributed to the relatively higher price of imported Galunggong.</p> <p>*As for the importation of Galunggong, Department of Agriculture spokesman Mr. Noel Reyes have announced that the Department has authorized BFAR to issue a Sanitary and Phytosanitary Import Clearance (SPSIC) and Certificate of Necessity to Import. This paved the way for the Bureau to accept applications and issue permits to import marine fishes, including Galunggong. (Source: <i>The Philippine Star</i>, December 6, 2019, Retrieved from: https://www.philstar.com/headlines/2019/12/06/1974779/philippines-import-galunggong-new)</p> <p>*Meanwhile, there is an observed increase in the prevailing wholesale price of Tilapia. Per brokers/traders, this is due to the low volume of supply coming and farmgate price from major source areas (e.g., Batangas). It was also derived from interviews that some producers are extending their culture period in an effort to increase the price and value of their Tilapia in time for the Christmas holidays.</p> <p>*As for Bangus, some brokers/traders noted that the price and supply of the said commodity are stable. However, some brokers/traders are said to have decreased their selling price due to the decrease in the demand (i.e., matumal ang bentahan).</p>
