Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors this week:

1. Tropical Storm "Pepito" brought irregularities in the volume of catch and quality of marine commodities, including Local-Fresh Galunggong, unloaded at Navotas Fish Port. This caused prices of marine commodities to be unstable.
2. No Imported-Frozen Galunggong was available at Navotas Fish Port this week due to irregular unloading as only few importers are allowed to sell.
3. Adequate displays of Bangus and Tilapia continue to be observed at Navotas Fish Port. However, only small-sized Bangus from Bulacan were unloaded at the port on October 23.
4. Major source areas of the top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port are as follows:
 - a. Bangus - Pangasinan
 - b. Tilapia - Batangas
 - c. Local galunggong – Palawan
5. Wearing of face masks and face shields, mandatory temperature checks, and hand disinfection are still in place at the Navotas Fish Port as precaution against the increasing number of COVID-19 cases.
