Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors this week:

- Throughout the week, no Local-fresh Galunggong and Alumahan were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale). The unavailability of the commodities may still be the effects of the following:
 - closed fishing season (CFS) for pelagic fishes in Northeastern Palawan and Visayan Sea, which are major fishing grounds for Galunggong and Alumahan;
 - cold weather condition which causes marine commodities to stay at the bottom of the ocean, making them harder to catch;
 - high fishing operational cost and low volume of catch, urging some municipal fisherfolk to not engage in fishing activities.
 - bright light brought by the occurrence of full moon or "Beaver Moon" on November 30; and
 - Occurrence of Habagat or Northeast Monsoon;
- Imported-frozen Galunggong, on the other hand, has irregular availability at the fish port throughout the week. More specifically, the imported commodity was only available on Dec. 1.
- For Bangus and Tilapia, supplies at the fish port were stable for the whole week.
- Major source areas of the top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port are as follows:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local-Fresh Galunggong - NA
- The Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues the strict implementation of precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 such as but not limited to wearing of face masks, face shields, white boots, and white shirts; limiting of buyers entering the market at a time; and mandatory temperature checks and hadn disinfection at Navotas Fish Port.
