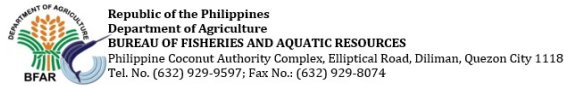

Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors this week:

- Local-fresh Galunggong was noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) only on December 10 as availability of marine commodities continue to be affected by the Closed Fishing Season (CFS) for pelagic fishes in Northeastern Palawan and Visayan Sea, which are major fishing grounds for the said marine commodities. Further, the cold weather condition also causes marine fishes to stay at the bottom of the ocean, resulting to little to no Galunggong catch.
- Meanwhile, Alumahan was available only in limited volumes on December 11. Supplies were reportedly unloaded from Zamboanga and are of low quality in terms of freshness; hence, its relatively low price.
- Imported-frozen Galunggong, on the other hand, was not available at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) throughout the week.
- For Bangus and Tilapia, no changes were reported at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) as supplies of said commodities remain sufficient for the demand.
- Major source areas of the top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port are as follows:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local-Fresh Galunggong - Palawan
- Despite the increasing holidays, influx of people at Navotas Fish Port remain low. Nonetheless, precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 are still administered by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority in the monitored markets to ensure the safety of vendors and consumers.
