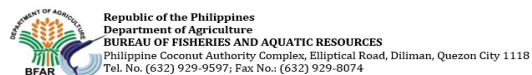

Remarks/Market Observations:

April 19-25, 2020:

- Ample supplies of tilapia, bangus, and fresh and imported marine commodities at the Navotas Fish Port.
- Large unloadings of lower priced medium-sized (3-5 pcs.) bangus from Pangasinan
- The bulk of tilapia supply at the fish port are from Batangas.
- Local galunggong is sold at a higher price due to its high demand.
- Fewer buyers are observed at the Navotas Fish Port as a result of numerous policies aimed at promoting physical distancing (e.g., market window hours, limited number of buyers inside the market at a time).
- Some vendors opted not to open their stalls due to "matumal na bentahan" caused by low influx of buyers in the markets.
- The following policies have been implemented at the Fish Port relative to the COVID-19 outbreak:
 - Wearing of face mask, white shirt, and boots;
 - PFDA-issued ID card must be shown to allow entry;
 - Thermal scanning before entry;
 - Washing of hands at the designated washing area;
 - Disinfecting boots at the designated three-stage footbath; and
 - Observance of physical distancing
