Remarks/Market Observations:		<p>The following observations were gathered during the actual price monitoring activities (April 26-30, 2020):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Prices of bangus and tilapia are stable due to abundant unloading and low demand. Large volumes of small to medium-sized galunggong are unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port. Lesser traders and brokers observed as a result of the strict implementation of various Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) measures at the Navotas Fish Port. Some traders and brokers also started selling lesser volumes in order to sell out their supplies and recover their capital. Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) has implemented the following preventive measures at the Navotas Fish Port Complex: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Wearing of face mask, white shirts, and boots Showing NFPC-issued ID card upon entry Thermal scanner before entry Disinfection of boots on the three-stage footbath Maintaining of social distancing
