Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered during the price monitoring activities this week (May 24-31, 2020):

1. Large volumes of Local Galunggong (Babae & Lalaki) and various marine fishery commodities are observed unloaded at the fish port this week. Bangus and Tilapia are also in sufficient supplies. However, Bangus is sold at a higher price due to the available supplies being 2-3 pcs/kg, which is a mixture of medium to large-sized.
2. Local Galunggong unloaded at the fish port are of lower quality (in terms of freshness), resulting to a higher demand for imported galunggong.
3. Other frozen fish commodities are being traded at the fish port.
4. There continues to be low influx of buyers at the Navotas Fish Port.
5. The Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues its strict implementation of precautionary management measures related to the COVID-19 pandemic.
6. Navotas Fish Port Complex continues to be under Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) until the end of May 2020.
