**Remarks/Market Observations:**

The following observations were gathered during this week's price monitoring activities:

1. Stable supply and price of Tilapia was observed at the Navotas Fish Port. However, wholesale price of Bangus increased due to the relatively larger sizes (2-3 pcs/kg) unloaded.
2. Abundant supply of Local Galunggong other marine commodities were unloaded. However, selling price is relatively higher due to the good quality and even sizes of supplies unloaded. Further, no medium-sized local galunggong, and only large-sized galunggong were unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port on June 6.
3. Imported galunggong were also being traded in large quantities. Supplies, however, are mostly brought to nearby provinces or are bought by processors for making smoked fish or "tinapa"
4. Low influx of buyers remained to be observed in the monitored wholesale market.
5. The Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues the strict implementation of precautionary management measures at the Navotas Fish Port as stated in previous reports. Further, Navotas Fish Port (Markets 1 to 5) was closed from June 6 to 7 for regular cleaning and disinfection.
6. Metro Manila has transitioned to General Community Quarantine effective June 1, thereby easing restrictions from Modified ECQ.
