Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Supplies of Bangus and Tilapia remain stable at the Navotas Fish Port.
- Local Galunggong, however, is not available at the fish port as available supplies are mostly small-sized. According to vendors, the decreasing supply of captured fisheries is attributable to the lean fishing season for marine commodities.
- Other marine commodities such as Galunggong Lalaki & Babae, Gulyasan, Turay, and Hipon, are also observed at the Navotas Fish Port.
- Frozen fishery commodities, including Imported Galunggong, are also being sold in the market. However, imported Galunggong at the Navotas Fish Port are either brought to provinces or bought by fish processors for producing smoked Galunggong or "Tinapa".
- Navotas City will be placed in Community Lockdown from July 16 to 29 to control and prevent the transmission of COVID-19 amid the increasing number of cases in the city. Price monitoring activity at the Navotas Fish Port was done through telecommunication for the duration of the lockdown.
- In relation to the lockdown, Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues the strict implementation of preventive measures relative to COVID-19.
