Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors:

- Relatively lower volumes of fresh marine commodities, including local galunggong, were unloaded this week amid the lean fishing season. On July 24, only one fishing vessel unloaded local galunggong, majority of which are small variants. The unpredictable volume of unloaded marine species at the Navotas Fish Port causes the higher selling price at the port.
- Dominant source areas for the top fishery commodities:
 Commodity Wholesale (Navotas Fish Port)
 Bangus Pangasinan
 Tilapia Batangas
 Local Galunggong Palawan
- Imported galunggong, among other frozen fishery commodities, were also observed at the fish port.
- Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to implement precautionary management measures aimed at preventing the further spread of COVID-19 at the Navotas Fish Port.
- Data gathering at Navotas Fish Port is conducted via phone calls or SMS with the market personnel in view of the Bureau's suspension of physical monitoring activities amid increasing COVID-19 cases.
