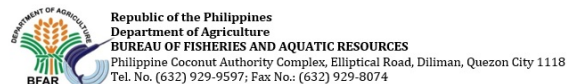

Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors this week:

- The price of Bangus and Tilapia remain the same from the previous week due to the stable supply and demand of the commodities.
- Supply of marine commodities, including Local Galunggong, decreased this week due to the low unloading at the Navotas Fish Port due to the (1) lean fishing season, (2) heavy rainfalls caused by Typhoon "Dindo", and (3) the occurrence of full moon last August 3.
- Top fishery commodities at the Navotas Fish Port are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong - Palawan
- Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) has conducted the fifth (5th) general cleaning and disinfection at the Navotas Fish Port on August 1 to 2.
- The implementation of Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) further contribute to the low influx of buyers and decreasing number of operational fish stalls at the monitored markets. PFDA continues the enforcement of intensified precautionary measures (i.e., wearing of face masks and face shields, requirement of quarantine passes upon entry, mandatory temperature check) aligned with the MECQ.
- Data gathering at the Navotas Fish Port is conducted through phone calls or SMS in coordination with market masters and administrators, vendors, and stall holders in view of the Bureau's suspension of physical monitoring activities.
