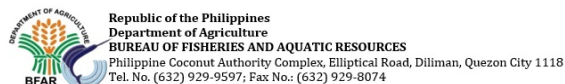

Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors this week:

- The prevailing prices of Bangus and Tilapia remained stable due to enough supply and demand at the Navota Fish Port.
- Local Galunggong is also sold at a higher price due to the less volume of unloading at the fish port as a result of the current lean fishing season for marine commodities alongside the rainy weather condition brought about by Tropical Depression "Ferdie".
- Prevailing price of Imported Galunggong increased due to higher demand in response to the low availability of Fresh Galunggong at the Fish Port.
- Top fishery commodities at the Navotas Fish Port are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong – Palawan
- Same preventive measures for buyers and traders are being implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) to avoid COVID-19 transmission inside the fish port. Weekly disinfection is also being implemented at the Navotas Fish Port.
- Data gathering at the Navotas Fish Port is conducted through phone calls or SMS in coordination with market masters and administrators, vendors, and stall holders in view of the Bureau's suspension of physical monitoring activities since July 21, 2020. Physical monitoring will resume once safety of enumerators in the monitored wet markets are ascertained.
