**Remarks/Market Observations:**

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors this week:

- The prevailing prices of Bangus and Tilapia remained stable due to the enough supply and current low demand at the Navotas Fish Port.
- Bangus from Laguna was also observed at the fish port but in small size (5-6pcs/kg).
- Unloading of Local Galunggong at the Navotas Fish Port this week continue to be relatively low due to the current lean season for marine commodities alongside the rainy weather condition. This resulted to the higher wholesale price of medium-sized Local Galunggong at Php130.00/kg.
- Imported Galunggong, being a substitute commodity for fresh commodities, has high supply at Navotas Fish Port this week as the unloaded volume of fresh marine commodities continue to low.
- Top fishery commodities at the Navotas Fish Port are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Pangasinan
  - Tilapia - Batangas
  - Local galunggong – Palawan
- Same preventive measures for buyers and traders are being implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) to avoid COVID-19 transmission inside the fish port. Weekly disinfection is also being implemented at the Navotas Fish Port.
- Data gathering at Navotas Fish Port is conducted through phone calls or SMS in coordination with market masters and administrators, vendors, and stall holders in view of the Bureau's suspension of physical monitoring activities since July 21, 2020. Physical monitoring will resume once safety of enumerators in the monitored wet markets is ascertained.
