**Remarks/Market Observations:**

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Relative to the consistently low demand for fishery commodities, volumes of Bangus and Tilapia were sufficient at Navotas Fish Port. Local Galunggong, however, is being sold at a relatively high wholesale price of Php140.00/kg at the fish port as only one (1) fishing vessel unloaded the said commodity this week. Further, the minimal availability of the commodity is caused by the hampered fishing operations brought about by the lean fishing season and rainy weather condition.
- Following are the dominant source areas of the top fishery commodities:  
 Commodity      Wholesale (Navotas Fish Port)  
 Bangus              Pangasinan  
 Tilapia              Batangas  
 Local Galunggong      Palawan
- Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues the implementation of precautionary management measures at Navotas Fish Port Complex in order to ensure the safety of vendors and buyers.
- Data gathering at Navotas Fish Port is conducted through phone calls or SMS in coordination with market masters and administrators, vendors, and stall holders in view of the Bureau's suspension of physical monitoring activities since July 21, 2020. Physical monitoring will resume once safety of enumerators in the monitored wet markets is ascertained.
