**Remarks/Market Observations:**

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Bangus and Tilapia remain adequate in volume while Local Galunggong continues to experience price fluctuations at Navotas Fish Port as volume of unloading remain unstable amid the lean fishing season and unfavorable weather condition this week.
- Following are the major source areas of the top fishery commodities:  
 Commodity      Wholesale (Navotas Fish Port)  
 Bangus              Pangasinan  
 Tilapia                Batangas  
 Local Galunggong      Palawan
- Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues the implementation of precautionary management measures at Navotas Fish Port Complex in order to ensure the safety of vendors and buyers. Wearing of face masks and face shields, mandatory temperature checks and hand disinfection, and other precautionary safety measures relative to COVID-19 are still in place at the wholesale market.
- Data gathering at Navotas Fish Port is conducted through phone calls or SMS in coordination with PFDA in view of the Bureau's suspension of physical monitoring activities since July 21, 2020. Physical monitoring will resume once safety of enumerators in the monitored wet markets is ascertained.
