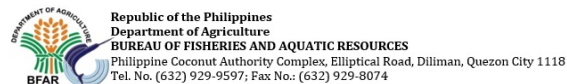

Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors this week:

1. Unloadings of Local Galunggong and other marine commodities remain minimal as the lean fishing season and unfavorable weather condition continue to cause low volume of marine catch; hence, the commodities are being traded at relatively higher price this week. Bangus and Tilapia, on the other hand, has stable supply and pricing at Navotas Fish Port. This week, higher demand for Imported Galunggong was observed at Navotas Fish Port as some traders or retailers opt to sell the imported commodity as its local variant remains low in availability and high in price.
2. Major source areas of the top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port are as follows:
 - a. Bangus - Pangasinan
 - b. Tilapia - Batangas
 - c. Local galunggong – Palawan
3. Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to strictly implement mandatory wearing of face mask, face shield, white boots and white shirt, and requirement of quarantine passes upon entry and temperature check, among others, at Navotas Fish Port to avoid COVID-19 transmission among vendors and buyers at Navotas Fish Port.
4. Data gathering at Navotas Fish Port is conducted through phone calls or SMS in coordination with market masters and administrators, vendors, and stall holders in view of the Bureau's temporary suspension of physical monitoring activities beginning July 21 Physical monitoring will resume once safety of enumerators in the monitored wet markets are ascertained.
