Remarks/Market Observations:		<p>The following observations were gathered from market personnel:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Local Galunggong and Alumahan continues to have no unloading at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) throughout the week. The unavailability of the said fresh marine commodities may be attributed to the cold weather condition, which drives fish to the bottom of the ocean, making them harder to catch. In addition, the implementation of Closed Fishing Season (CFS) in Northeastern Palawan (until Jan. 31) and in Visayan Sea (until Feb. 15) also contribute to the unstable and limited availability of the said commodities. Bangus and Tilapia, on the other hand, continue to have sufficient unloadings at the fish port. Imported-frozen Galunggong was also noted at the fish port this week as an alternative commodity to Local-fresh Galunggong, which is currently sold at a relatively higher price amid its limited availability. Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Bangus - Pangasinan Tilapia - Batangas Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to implement precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 at Navotas Fish Port. Such measures include wearing of face masks and face shields, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection.
