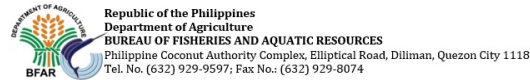

Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors this week:

- There is still limited availability of fresh marine commodities unloaded at Navotas Fish Port due to the effects of the cold weather condition brought about by the Northeast Monsoon or *Hanging Amihan*. Moreover, Tropical Storm Auring, which had its landfall last Feb. 21, has also hampered fishing operations in major fishing grounds, causing low volume of unloaded supplies in the early part of the week.
- Imported-frozen Galunggong continues to be available at Navotas Fish Port this week as an alternative to its local variant. However, its wholesale prices remain volatile depending of the unloaded volume of fresh marine commodities.
- Pelagic fish caught from major fishing grounds (i.e., Northeastern Palawan and the Visayan Sea), which recently underwent Closed Fishing Season (CFS) appeared to have not mature in sizes yet. As a result, most of the supplies of marine fresh commodities unloaded at Navotas Fish Port were mostly small-sized.
- Aquaculture commodities like Bangus and Tilapia remained sufficient at Navotas Fish Port.
- Major source areas of the top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port are as follows:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
- Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) is continuously implementing precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 in Navotas Fish Port. Such measures include wearing of face masks and face shields, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection.
