Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and administrators:

- Bangus and Tilapia have sufficient unloadings and relatively stable prices at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale).
- No medium-sized Local-fresh galunggong and Alumahan were unloaded at the fish port this week. However, large volumes of other fresh marine commodities (i.e., small-sized Galunggong, Turay, Pusit, Tamban, Gulyasan, and Dalagang Bukid Bilog) were noted. The unpredictable availability of fresh marine commodities may be attributed to the cold weather condition brought by the Northeast Monsoon or *Hanging Amihan*.
- On the other hand, Imported-frozen Galunggong continue to be available at the fish port as an alternative commodity to its local variant.
- Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Imported-frozen Galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) is continuously implement precautionary safety measures (e.g wearing of face mask and face shields, regular cleaning and disinfection) at Navotas Fish Port to ensure that vendors and buyers are protected against the further spread of COVID-19.
