Remarks/Market Observations:		The following observations were gathered from market personnel: 1. Volume of unloaded fresh marine commodities, including Local-fresh Galunggong, at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) were lower but still sufficient. This may be an effect of the full moon or "Pink Moon" on April 26, wherein the bright moonlight pushes fishes to the bottom of the ocean, making them harder to catch. 2. Amid the low availability of fresh marine commodities this week, ample volumes of Imported-frozen Galunggong were available in the fish port as an alternative commodity to its local variant. 3. Bangus and Tilapia, among other aquacultured fishery commodities, have stable prices and sufficient supplies coming from major source areas. It was also noted that majority of the Bangus supplies at the fish port are medium to large-sized. 4. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas: a. Bangus - Pangasinan b. Tilapia - Batangas c. Imported Galunggong - China, Vietnam 5. The Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to implement precautionary measures against COVID-19 (e.g., wearing of face mask and face shields as well as white boots and white shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) to safeguard vendors and consumers against the virus.
