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Remarks/Market Observations:		<p>*Major Source Areas of Top 3 Commodities: 1. Bangus = Laguna , Bulacan, Rizal, Pampanga, Batangas and Pangasinan 2. Tilapia =Batangas 3.1 Galunggong =Palawan 3.2 Imported Galunggong = China, Vietnam</p> <p>*The prevailing wholesale price of medium-sized Bangus for this month remained low at Php110/kg. According to some interviewed market vendors, this might be due to the abundant supply of the said commodity alongside the low demand from the customers (i.e., "matumal ang bentahan"). It was also derived during market interviews that some brokers/traders are selling their Bangus at a very low price to avoid spoilage and just get back their capital. *Generally, the prevailing wholesale prices of Bangus, Tilapia and local Galunggong are low this month. Based on the interviews during the price monitoring activity, the primary arising reasons are (1) low demand from the customers (i.e., "matumal ang bentahan"), (2) Abundant supply of the three commodities, and (3) the competitive market among said commodities. *As for the low price of local Galunggong, it was derived from communication with market vendors that this might be due to the abundant supply of local Galunggong, which is easier to sell and is more preferred by customers as compared to imported GG. It was also noted that the number of traders/brokers that sell imported Galunggong increased during the 4th week of this month (April 22-26) due to the full moon where there is a low supply because of the difficulty in catching marine fishes. *It can also be noted that majority of the local Galunggong being sold at the Navotas Fish Port this month are small to medium-sized and only a few are large-sized. Based on the team's actual price monitoring, it was only in the 5th week of this month (April 29-May 3) hen the unloaded local Galunggong are of good quality in terms of sizes. *It was observed during the 5th week of this month that a large volume of Tulingan, (<i>Auxis rochei</i>) and Dalagang Bukid (<i>Pterocaesio digramma</i>) were unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port.</p>
