Tilapia = Batangas 3.1 Galunggong = Palawan 3.2 Imported Galunggong = China and Vietnam</p> <p>*Based on the team's actual price monitoring, the supply of marine commodities, including local Galunggong, are affected by the rainy weather and the recurring strong wind brought about by the tropical storm "Hanna" on the first week of the month (August 5-9, 2019) and the continuous heavy monsoon rains ("Habagat"). These disturbances hindered fisherfolk from continuing their fishing operations, resulting to a low volume of catch and unloading at the Navotas Fish Port. The occurrence of full moon last August 15, where marine fishes are normally scattered and difficult to catch, also contributed to the low supply.</p> <p>*The supply of Tilapia also decreased this month as compared to last month. One of possible reason for this observation is the reduction of fish cage in Batangas which is one of its major source areas.</p> <p>*The low supply of local Galunggong and Tilapia had caused a small increment in its prevailing wholesale prices. It also caused an increase in the number of brokers/trader that sell frozen/imported fishery commodities at the Navotas Fish Port.</p> <p>*As for Bangus, the supply of the said commodity at the Navotas Fish Port remained stable for the whole month.</p> <p>*Some traders/brokers were also observed to be selling their supply of small-sized Bangus at a higher price as compared to medium and large-sized due to the higher demand for small-sized as compared to the other sizes.</p> <p>*The demand for the fishery commodities is still low (i.e., matumal ang bentahan) which might contribute to the relatively low prices of the fishery commodities.</p> <p>Note: (NS=No Submission) There is no price monitoring conducted on the forth week of this month (August 26-30) due to the unavailability of the enumerators because of the Training-Workshop attended by the enumerators.</p>
