Tilapia = Batangas 3.1 Galunggong = Palawan 3.2 Imported Galunggong = China, Indonesia, and Vietnam</p> <p>*The three-month fishing ban for Sardines, Herrings (<i>Sardinella spp.</i>), and Mackerels (<i>Rastrelliger spp.</i>) in some parts of the Visayan Sea (per Fisheries Administrative Order No. 167-3 Series of 2013) ended last 15 February 2020. *Other Closed Fishing Season for Sardines in some parts of the Zamboanga Sea per BFAR Administrative Circular (BAC) 255, Series of 2014, is set to end on March 1, 2020.</p> <p>The following observations were gathered during the actual price monitoring activities for the month of February:</p> <p>*A major increase in the supply of local Galunggong (<i>Decapterus spp.</i>) was observed at the Navotas Fish Port. The said observation may be attributed to the lifting of the Closed Fishing Season (CFS) in the Northern Palawan last 31 January 2020. However, most of the available local Galunggong are small-sized, with a few medium-sized. *The supply of other marine fishes, except local Galunggong, remain low from the first to third week of the month. The supply of the said commodities continue to be affected by: (a) the cold weather, which cause the marine fishes to stay at the bottom of the ocean resulting to a low volume of catch; (b) the occurrence of full moon last February 9, 2020, the bright moonlight causing the marine fishes to scatter; and (c) the fishing ban for some marine fishes. *The supply of the marine commodities increased last 28 February 2020. Majority of the available are <i>Loligo spp.</i>, <i>Auxis rochei</i>, <i>Decapterus spp.</i>, <i>Katsuwonus pelamis</i>, <i>Pterocaesio digramma</i>, <i>Decapterus spp.</i> etc. *The volume of frozen/imported commodities, especially Squid, Salmon Head, and Galunggong, remain high. *The supply of Tilapia at the Navotas Fish Port increased in the first week of this month and was stable until third week due to the increase in the supply from Batangas. However, the farmgate and the wholesale price of the commodity was reportedly high. *The Bangus supply remain stable due to the sufficient volume from Bulacan, Rizal, and Pangasinan. However, there is still no supply of Bangus Batangas observed at the market. *There were feedback that some brokers/traders decreased their selling price of Bangus and Tilapia due to the low demand from buying public (i.e., matumal ang bentahan).</p>
