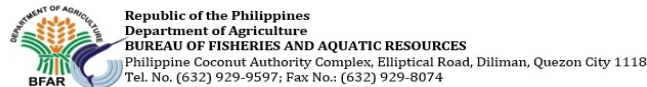

Remarks/Market Observations:		<p>The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of January:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Limited supplies of Local-fresh Galunggong and Alumahan were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) throughout the month, from at the most two (2) companies. The irregular and limited availability of fresh marine commodities may still be the effects of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Implementation of Closed Fishing Season (CFS) for pelagic fishes in Northeastern Palawan (lifted this Jan. 31) and Visayan Sea (until Feb. 15), which are major fishing grounds for the above-stated commodities; (b) Cold weather condition, which causes marine commodities to stay at the bottom of the ocean, making them harder to catch; and (c) Occurrence of Northeast Monsoon or <i>Hanging Habagat</i>. Supply of Imported-frozen Galunggong was observed to have regular availability at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this month unlike on January, where availability of the imported commodity is irregular. Frozen Big-eye scad (<i>Selar sp.</i>) was also observed this month as more importers were allowed to import frozen fishery commodities. The higher availability of the said imported-frozen commodities resulted to a sudden decrease in their respective wholesale prices. Supplies of aquacultured commodities, including Bangus and Tilapia, continue to have sufficient unloadings at Navotas Fish Port from major source areas. Pangasinan, continues to be the major source area for Bangus while Batangas for Tilapia. Fresh marine commodities like Tahong, Gulyasan, Tamban, Tangigue, Dalagang Bukid Bilog, Pusit Bisaya, Alumahan, local galunggong "lalaki", galunggong "burot" and yellowfin were available at Navotas Fish Port but in low volumes only. Following are the dominant source areas of the top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Bangus - Pangasinan (b) Tilapia - Batangas (c) Local Galunggong - NA (d) Imported Galunggong - China & Vietnam (e) Alumahan - NA Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continuously ensures the implementation of precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 at the Navotas Fish Port. These measures include wearing of face masks and face shields, mandatory temperature checks and hand disinfection as well as regular clean-up and disinfection.
