Remarks/Market Observations:	<p>*Major Source Areas of Top 3 commodities; 1. Bangus = Laguna , Bulacan, Rizal, Pampanga, Batangas, Pangasinan, and Navotas, Malabon, & Farmers Markets 2. Tilapia = Batangas, Bulacan, Pampanga, and Navotas, Malabon, & Farmers Markets 3. Galunggong = Zambales, Quezon Province, Palawan, and Navotas, Malabon, & Farmers Markets</p> <p>*It was observed during the team's actual price monitoring that the supply of marine fishes, including local Galunggong, is currently low due to the following factors: (1) the rainy weather brought about by typhoon Egay on the first week (July 1-5), tropical storm Falcon and tropical depression Goring on the third week (July 15-19), and the low pressure area (LPA) on the 5th week (July 29-August 2), which urged some fisherfolk to halt their fishing operations resulting to a low unloading at fishing ports; (2) the occurrence of full moon last July 17 wherein marine fishes are usually scattered, making them difficult to catch; and (3) the nearing of lean season for marine commodities, as noted by some market vendors, which might have contributed to the low volume of catch.</p> <p>*The rainy weather also caused some market vendors to not open their stalls due to lack in supply and lesser demand in majority of the monitored retail markets.</p> <p>*Based on the gathered observations, there is an abundant supply of marine fishery commodities during the second week of this month (July 8-12). Specifically, the following commodities have high volume of unloading at the fish ports: local Galunggong "Lalaki" (<i>Decapterus macrosoma</i>) and Galunggong "Balsa" (<i>Decapterus macarellus</i>).</p> <p>*As for Bangus and Tilapia, the supply of the said commodities remained stable in all the monitored retail markets.</p> <p>*It was noted that the price of live Tilapia in some of the monitored retail markets is higher by Php20.00/kg as compared to fresh dead Tilapia.</p> <p>*The low demand for fishery commodities is also caused vendors to either limit their supply of commodities or sell their fish products at a lower price to avoid spoilage and get back their capital.</p> <p>*Despite the forementioned observations, the prevailing retail prices of medium-sized Bangus, Tilapia and Galunggong remain unchanged from last month at Php160.00/kg, Php100.00/kg and Php160.00/kg, respectively.</p> <p>*The supply of Bangus, Tilapia and Galunggong in majority of the monitored markets are being sold in mixed sizes.</p> <p>*There was also a noted decrease in market vendors during the August 2 price monitoring activity due to the local government's clearing operations.</p>
