Remarks/Market Observations:

Week 1:
 1. There is stable volume of unloadings of Bangus and Tilapia, alongside the very low demand from consumers.
 2. Local Galunggong is sourced from three (3) fishing vessel operators, resulting to a wide range of prices. According to brokers, price vary in terms of the quality of fish (freshness, sizes and mixed with other species).
 3. Dominant sources for the following fishery commodities:
 Commodity Wholesale (Navotas Fish Port)
 Bangus Pangasinan
 Tilapia Batangas
 Local Galunggong Palawan
 4. According to some vendors, there is a decrease in supply relative to the transition period to lean fishing season.
 5. There is available local Galunggong Lalaki & Babae, Tulingan, Gulyasan, Yellow Fin, Balsa and other mixed fishery commodities available at the market.
 6. Frozen fishery commodities are still being traded at the Navotas Fish Port.
 7. Only few buyers were noted at Navotas Fish Port due to the flooding caused by the high tide.
 8. Navotas Fish Port Markets 1-5 is scheduled for a monthly cleaning and disinfection on July 4 to 5. All traders and buyers have been advised that the Port will be close.
 9. Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to implement preventive measures for buyers and traders relative to COVID-19 outbreak.

Week 2:
 1. Bangus and Tilapia still have stable supplies due to the availability from major sources. Bangus are sourced out from Pangasinan, Bulacan, Laguna while Tilapia from Batangas.
 2. Price of Local Galunggong increased due to the unloaded volume being of good quality, medium to large in sizes, and no other marine fishes mixed in the tubs.
 3. Despite the lean fishing season, relatively larger volumes of marine commodities including Galunggong Babae, Tulingan, Gulyasan, Hipon and Isdang Bato were unloaded. Marine commodities are also observed to be more preferred by buyers and traders.
 4. Frozen commodities are still being traded at the Navotas Fish Port.
 5. Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to implement precautionary management measures aimed at preventing the further spread of COVID-19 at the Navotas Fish Port. Further, Navotas Fish Port conducted its monthly general clean-up and disinfection activity on July 4.

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Remarks/Market Observations:		<p>Week 3:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Supplies of Bangus and Tilapia remain stable at the Navotas Fish Port. Local Galunggong, however, is not available at the fish port as available supplies are mostly small-sized. According to vendors, the decreasing supply of captured fisheries is attributable to the lean fishing season for marine commodities. Other marine commodities such as Galunggong Lalaki & Babae, Gulyasan, Turay, and Hipon, are also observed at the Navotas Fish Port. Frozen fishery commodities, including Imported Galunggong, are also being sold in the market. However, imported Galunggong at the Navotas Fish Port are either brought to provinces or bought by fish processors for producing smoked Galunggong or "Tinapa". Navotas City will be placed in Community Lockdown from July 16 to 29 to control and prevent the transmission of COVID-19 amid the increasing number of cases in the city. Price monitoring activity at the Navotas Fish Port was done through telecommunication for the duration of the lockdown. In relation to the lockdown, Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues the strict implementation of preventive measures relative to COVID-19. 										
		<p>Week 4:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Relatively lower volumes of fresh marine commodities, including local galunggong, were unloaded this week amid the lean fishing season. On July 24, only one fishing vessel unloaded local galunggong, majority of which are small variants. The unpredictable volume of unloaded marine species at the Navotas Fish Port causes the higher selling price at the port. Dominant source areas for the top fishery commodities: Commodity Wholesale (Navotas Fish Port) Bangus Pangasinan Tilapia Batangas Local Galunggong Palawan Imported galunggong, among other frozen fishery commodities, were also observed at the fish port. Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to implement precautionary management measures aimed at preventing the further spread of COVID-19 at the Navotas Fish Port. Data gathering at Navotas Fish Port is conducted via phone calls or SMS with the market personnel in view of the Bureau's suspension of physical monitoring activities amid increasing COVID-19 cases. 										
		<p>Week 5:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Bangus and Tilapia are observed to be in sufficient volumes at the Navotas Fish Port. Local galunggong, however, have relatively lower availability at the fish port amid the lean fishing season for marine commodities. Major source areas of the top fishery commodities are: Commodity Wholesale (Navotas Fish Port) Bangus Pangasinan Tilapia Batangas Local Galunggong Palawan Imported galunggong, among other frozen fishery commodities, were also observed at the fish port. Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to implement precautionary management measures aimed at preventing the further spread of COVID-19 at the Navotas Fish Port. Citywide lockdown at Navotas was lifted on July 29, 2020. Data gathering at the fish port is conducted via phone calls or SMS with the market personnel in view of the Bureau's suspension of physical monitoring activities amid increasing COVID-19 cases. 										
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
