(CNN Philippines, 1 June 2019, Retrieved from: <a href="https://www.cnnphilippines.com/regional/2019/6/1/taal-lake-batangas-fish-kill.html">https://www.cnnphilippines.com/regional/2019/6/1/taal-lake-batangas-fish-kill.html</a>)</p> <p>*The supply of Tilapia from Batangas decreased on the second and third week of this month due to the recent fish kill in Taal Lake on the last week of May. However, market vendors opted to not increase their selling price due to the (1) low demand from the buying public, and (2) buyers used to buying at Php100.00/kg.  *Based on the team's actual price monitoring, the supply of marine fishes including Galunggong decreased on the third and fourth week of the month. As per actual price monitoring, this might be attributed to (1) the occurrence of full moon where marine fishes are scattered and difficult to catch; and (2) the rainy weather which caused fisherfolk to halt their fishing operations.  *As for Bangus, there is a stable supply of the said commodity in all the monitored retail markets.  *The demand for fishery commodities is low (i.e., matumal ang bentahan) which has caused vendors to sell their fish products at a lower price to avoid spoilage and just to get back their capital.  *The recurring water interruptions contributed to a lower demand for fish commodities because the buying public prefer ready-made products like canned goods, as per market vendors.  *Based on interviews, the low demand from the buying public has caused market vendors to limit their supply of fishery commodities and for some producers of Bangus to postpone their harvesting.  *Despite the forementioned observations, the prevailing retail prices of medium-sized Bangus, Tilapia and Galunggong remain low at Php160.00/kg, Php100.00/kg and Php160.00/kg, respectively.  *It was observed in some of monitored markets that the price of live Tilapia is higher by Php20.00/kg as compared to fresh dead Tilapia.  *The Bangus, Tilapia and Galunggong in majority of the monitored markets are being sold in mixed sizes.</p>
