Tilapia =Batangas 3.1 Galunggong =Palawan 3.2 Imported Galunggong = China and Vietnam</p> <p>Fish kill incident in Taal Lake in Batangas affected 121 fish cages in the villages of Buso-Buso and Gulod in Laurel town and Bañaga in Agoncillo, killing 600 tons of Tilapia worth around ₱42.9 million. (CNN Philippines, 1 June 2019, Retrieved from: https://www.cnnphilippines.com/regional/2019/6/1/taal-lake-batangas-fish-kill.html)</p> <p>*Based on the team's actual monitoring, there is a decrease in the supply of Tilapia from Batangas during the first and second week of this month. According to brokers/traders, this might be caused by the recent fish kill incident in the Taal lake on the last week of May 2019. It was also noted that some Tilapia brokers/traders had a small increment of approximately Php5.00/kg in their selling price.</p> <p>*The supply of marine fishes including local Galunggong decreased during the third and fourth week of the month. As per actual price monitoring, this might be attributed to (1) the occurrence of full moon where marine fishes are scattered and difficult to catch; and (2) the rainy weather, which caused fisherfolk to halt their fishing operations.</p> <p>*As for Bangus, there is an abundant supply of the said commodity at the Navotas Fish Port.</p> <p>*It was also observed that some brokers/trader at the Navotas Fish Port are making their own supply of frozen local Galunggong.</p> <p>*Due to the decrease in the supply of local Galunggong in the third and fourth week of the month, it was observed that there is an increase in the number of brokers/traders that sell frozen/imported GG.</p> <p>*Some traders/brokers were also observed to be selling their supply of small-sized Bangus at a higher price as compared to medium and large-sized due to the higher demand for small-sized as compared to the other sizes.</p> <p>*The demand for the fishery commodities is still low (i.e., matumal ang bentahan) which might contribute to the relatively low prices of the fishery commodities.</p>
