Remarks/Market Observations:		<p>*Majority of the source area of the top 3 commodities came from; 1. Bangus = Laguna , Bulacan, Rizal, Pampanga, Batangas and Pangasinan 2. Tilapia =Batangas, Rizal and Pampanga 3.1 Galunggong =Palawan 3.2 Imported Galunggong = China, Vietnam</p> <p>*The prevailing wholesale price of medium-sized Bangus for the month of March is relatively low at Php110/kg. According to some interviewed market vendors, this might be due to the abundance in supply of the said commodity alongside the low demand from the customers (i.e., "matumal ang bentahan"). It was also derived during market interviews that some vendors are selling their Bangus at a very low price to avoid spoilage and just get back their capital.</p> <p>*It was observed that the prevailing price of medium-sized Galunggong had an increasing trend this month.This might be attributed to two factors-- lesser supply of marine fishes (including Galunggong) due to the occurrence of full moon during the third week, and the quality of Galunggong unloaded at the fish port (in terms of freshness and size) during the fourth week.</p> <p>*It can also be noted that majority of the local Galunggong being sold at the Navotas Fish Port are small to medium-sized and only a few are large-sized.</p> <p>*It was observed that there was a noticeable decrease in the number of broker/trader that sell frozen/imported GG as compared to last January and February. According to some vendors, this is because local GG is easier to sell and is more preferred by customers as compared to imported GG. It was also noted that the prevailing price of the said commodity is low this month due to low demand from the customers (i.e., "matumal ang bentahan").</p> <p>*According to market vendors, lesser buyers are observed in the market starting on the 3rd week of this month (Mar.18-22) because they are saving up for the upcoming graduation ceremonies.</p> <p>Note: (NS=No Submission) There is no price monitoring conducted on the second week of this month (March 11-15) due to the unavailability of the enumerators because of the Training-Workshop on Fish Identification.</p>
