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Remarks/Market Observations:		<p>March 2-6, 2020:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The wholesale price of Bangus and Tilapia remain stable despite the low volume available at the Navotas Fish Port. This might be attributed to the large volume of fresh marine fishes unloaded at the fish port, which caused a lower demand for aquacultured commodities. Most of the available Bangus are big to jumbo-sized (1-2 pcs/kg). Eighty (80%) of the unloaded marine fishes are being sold mixed with other species (<i>Auxis spp.</i>, <i>Decapterus spp.</i>, <i>Sardinella spp.</i>, <i>Rastrillegger spp.</i>, <i>Seala spp.</i> etc). Abundant volume of Squid (Kalawang) observed in the market. Large volumes of frozen/imported commodities continue to be available at the Navotas Fish Port despite the availability of local Galunggong. Majority of the frozen commodities are Squid, Salmon Head, and Galunggong. The price of imported commodities decreased due to the lower demand from the buying public, alongside the buyers' preference of fresh marine fishes over imported. Tilapia supply at the Navotas Fish Port decreased this week due to the lesser supply coming from Batangas. The farmgate price and wholesale price of the said commodity remain high. <p>March 9-13, 2020:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The price of Bangus and Tilapia remain stable due to the ample volume at the Navotas Fish Port. There are still frozen fishery commodities being sold in the market. However, lesser imported Galunggong is observed due to the availability of local Galunggong. Most of the unloaded fishery commodities are of poor quality and are being sold mixed with other species. Less volume of marine fishes unloaded at the Fish Port due to the occurrence of full moon on March 9, 2020, which hindered some fishing operations. <p>March 16-20,2020:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The price of Bangus had a small increment due to the lower volume of supply. This may be attributed to the lesser <i>vijeros</i> arriving at the Fish Port due to the ECQ. The price of Tilapia remain relatively higher. A large volume of marine fishes, including Local Galunggong, Tamban, Matambaka, and Alumahan, are unloaded at the Fish Port. Lesser vendors and buyers are observed at the Navotas Fish Port. There is an abundance of frozen fishery commodities at the market. <p>March 23-27, 2020</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Large volumes of small to medium-sized Galunggong (<i>Decapterus spp.</i>) are reported at the Navotas Fish Port. Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA), as part of its precautionary measures against the COVID-19 outbreak, has imposed a "No ID, No Entry" policy at the Navotas Fish Port and shifted the trading hours effective March 25, 2020: +4:00 PM to 1:00 AM (Operation hours during the ECQ) +7:00 PM to 3:00 AM (Operation hours before the ECQ)
