REMARKS AND OBSERVATIONS

CAR

Week 1- April 4-10, 2021

Sufficient supplies of fishery commodities coming from nearby regions (Region 1 and NCR) were noted in the Cordillera Region this week.

Week 2- April 11-17, 2021

Implementation of precautionary measures against COVID-19 such as wearing of face masks and face shields, and mandatory temperature checks are observed in the monitored markets in the region. Imported-frozen Galunggong and Local-fresh Galunggong were available in the monitored markets this week.

Weeks 3-4 April 18-30, 2021

Despite the pandemic, supply of fishery commodities in the region remain sufficient amid the ample volumes coming from Regions 1 and 4A as well as NCR (Navotas Fish Port).

R1

Week 1- April 4-10, 2021

Imported-frozen Galunggong continues to be available in selected monitored markets in the region.

With the continuously increasing COVID-19 cases, markets in the region remain stringent in the implementation of safety protocols such as mandatory wearing of face masks and face shields.

Dagupan City remains to be the main source of fishery commodities in the region.

Week 3- April 18-24, 2021

Precautionary measures against COVID-19 remain in place among the major wet markets in the region.

Week 4- April 25-30, 2021

Among the monitored markets, health protocols such as mandatory wearing of face masks and face shields are in place as precaution against COVID-19.

Still, most of the available fishery commodities in the region are from Dagupan City, Majority of the fishery commodities are from Dagupan City.

Presence of imported Galunggong was noted in San Fernando City Public Market with prices ranging from Php140.00 to 240.00/kg.

R3	<p>Weeks 2-3 April 11-24 2021 Minimal number of buyers were noted in the public markets this week due to the strict implementation of Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) in the region.</p>

Meanwhile, in Biliran, only limited supplies of Seaweeds were available. Alumahan has unstable and limited availability in the monitored retail markets, wherein majority of the available supplies are large-sized. With the commodity's unavailability in Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), most of Alumahan supplies this week are sourced from Malabon Fish Port (caught in Lucena, Quezon).

Aquacultured commodities, such as Bangus and Tilapia, has sufficient volumes and stable prices in the the monitored retail markets.

Top fishery commodities in the sixteen (16) monitored retail markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:

- a. Bangus - Bulacan
- b. Tilapia - Batangas
- c. Local Galunggong -Navotas Fish Port (Palawan) & Lucena, Quezon
- d. Alumahan - Malabon Fish Port (Lucena, Quezon)

With the implementation of Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) in NCR Plus (inc. Bulacan, Cavite, Laguna, and Rizal) until Apr. 11, low influx of buyers continue to be apparent in the monitored retail markets. Still, vendors are limiting their fishery commodities for selling or are offering commodities at a lower price to ensure that all displays are sold out by the end of the day.

In view of this, market administrators are continuously ensuring the strict implementation of precautionary safety measures in the monitored retail markets.

In view of the continuously increasing COVID-19 cases, no physical price monitoring activity was conducted at Pasay Public Market and Navotas Fish Port Markets 3-5. Meanwhile, in the markets monitored by BFAR CO, data gathering is done via text and call and covers only the Top 4 Commodities (Bangus, Tilapia, Local-fresh & Imported-frozen Galunggong, Alumahan). Resumption of physical price monitoring activities in the monitored markets will be subject to risk assessment with the top management.

Week 2- April 11-17, 2021

Sufficient volumes of fresh marine commodities, particularly Local-fresh Galunggong, were noted in the monitored markets this week. Relative to this, lesser displays of Imported-frozen Galunggong were noted as vendors opt to sell the local variant as it is more preferred by the consumers.

On the other hand, quacultured commodities such as Bangus and Tilapia have sufficient availability and stable prices in the monitored markets.

Low demand for fishery commodities remain apparent in most markets. With this, vendors are adapting ways to ensure that all fish displays are sold out by the end of the day. Among these measures are selling limited volumes and variety of fishery commodities. Meanwhile, some vendors are opening their fish stalls only on weekends where there is higher influx of people.

Week 3- April 18-24, 2021

Abundant supplies of small - and medium-sized Local-fresh Galunggong were observed in the monitored retail markets this week. As a result, most vendors are no longer selling its imported variant. More specifically, this week, only Trabajo Market was noted to have medium-sized Imported-frozen Galunggong, while Mega-Q, Farmers and Balintawak Markets have large-sized Imported-fro

Stable prevailing prices and sufficient volumes remain apparent for Bangus and Tilapia amid its ample availability from major source areas and fish ports.

Top fishery commodities in the sixteen (16) monitored retail markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:

- a. Bangus - Bulacan
- b. Tilapia - Batangas
- c. Local Galunggong -Navotas Fish Port (Palawan) & Lucena, Quezon
- d. Alumahan - Malabon Fish Port (Lucena, Quezon)

Low influx of buyers was still observed at the monitored retail markets this week due to the extension of Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) in NCR until April 30, 2021. Consequently, some of the vendors opted not to open their stalls on a daily basis, limit the volume and variety of fish supplies for selling, and offer fishery commodities at a lower price range to sell out everything by the end of the day.

Market administrators are still ensuring the stringent implementation of precautionary measures against COVID-19 in accordance with MECQ (eg., wearing of face mask and face shields, mandatory temperature checks, and observance of physical distancing, among others) in the markets as precaution against COVID-19.

No physical price monitoring activity was conducted at Pasay Public Market and Navotas Fish Port Markets 3-5 this week due the strict lockdown implemented by their respective LGUs. Meanwhile, in the markets monitored by BFAR CO, data gathering is done via text and call and covers only the Top 4 Commodities (Bangus, Tilapia, Local-fresh & Imported-frozen Galunggong, Alumahan).

Resumption of physical price monitoring activities in the monitored markets will be subject to risk assessment with the top management.

Week 4- April 25-30, 2021

At retail level, the bright moonlight brought by the full moon or "Pink Moon" on April 26 may have caused low volume but still sufficient supplies of fresh marine commodities in major fish ports. Consequently, majority of the medium-sized Local-fresh Galunggong were sourced from Malabon Fish Port, meanwhile supplies of the commodity from Navotas Fish Port were only sorted from tubs of mixed fresh marine commodities.

With the ample availability of its local variant, only limited volumes of Imported-frozen Galunggong were noted in the monitored markets as vendors still prefer to sell its local variant as it is more preferred by consumers. More specifically, only larger sizes of the commodity were noted at Mega-Q, Farmers , Balintawak, and Mega-Q Markets this week.

Similarly, for Alumahan, only larger sizes were noted this week and in selected markets only (Muñoz, Mega-Q, Kamuning and Tandang Sora Markets).

Aquacultured commodities such as Bangus and Tilapia have sufficient supplies to cater the demand of the consumers.

Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets were sourced mainly from the following:

- a. Bangus - Bulacan
- b. Tilapia - Batangas
- c. Local-fresh Galunggong - Navotas and Malabon Fish Port
- d. Imported-frozen Galunggong - NA
- e. Alumahan - Lucena, Quezon

According to some vendors, "matumal na bentahan" or low demand remain apparent in the monitored markets. Consequently, most vendors are opting to not open their fish stalls on a daily basis, while others only open on weekends where higher influx of people is observed.

Precautionary measures against COVID-19 in accordance with the Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) such as wearing of face masks and face shields, mandatory temperature checks, and observance of physical distancing, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection are continuously observed in the monitored markets.

Due to the recent surge of COVID-19 cases in Metro Manila, physical monitoring activity in the eleven (11) retail markets conducted by BFAR FIDSSD is temporarily suspended beginning March 23 until further notice. Also, due to strict lockdown in the area per announcement of Pasay City Government, physical monitoring was also suspended in Pasay Public Market that is being monitored by BFAR-NCR.

General Observation

¹ Wide disparity in the prevailing price of medium-sized *Penaeus monodon* (Blacktiger Prawn) at Php350.00/kg - Php600.00/kg is brought about by differences in source area of displays. More specifically, low prevailing price of Php350.00/kg was derived from Regions 8, 12, and 13 where supplies of Blacktiger Prawn are derived from within the locality.

Meanwhile, higher prevailing price of Php600.00/kg was recorded in Regions 1, 5, and NCR where supplies of the commodity are sourced from farther areas (i.e., GenSan, Palawan, among others).

Fluctuation in the prices of the top fifteen (15) and other commodities is influenced by a number of factors such as the commodity's size, quality, volume of supply, source area, as well as the weather condition and other natural phenomena.
