Remarks/Market Observations:	<p>The following observations were gathered from market vendors and administrators for the month of November:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Prices of Bangus and Tilapia were stable this month as supplies remain sufficient among the monitored retail markets. On Nov. Weeks 1 and 2, supplies of marine commodities, particularly Local-fresh Galunggong and Alumahan, were very limited amid the onslaught of Super Typhoon Rolly and Super Typhoon Ulysses, which greatly affected Southern Luzon. In addition, the implementation of Closed Fishing Season (CFS) for pelagic fishes in Northeastern Palawan from Nov. 1, 2020 to Feb.15 and Visayan Sea from Nov. 15, 2020 to Feb. 15 will continue to affect Local-fresh Galunggong and other marine fishes supply. Imported-frozen Galunggong was available only in some markets. Further, the imported commodity is sold at only a relatively higher price as most consumers currently opt for the imported variant amid the high price and very limited availability of Local-fresh Galunggong. High selling price of fishery commodities in some markets may also be attributed to the prevalence of market layers wherein Kamuning, Galas, and Tandang Sora Markets source from primary markets (i.e., Farmers Market) . Following are the major source areas of the top fishery commodities in the monitored retail markets: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Bangus - Bulacan Tilapia - Batangas Local-Fresh Galunggong - Lucena, Quezon Minimal number of buyers are still observed in most monitored markets. This urged vendors to sell out remaining stocks from previous days, sell only limited volumes of fishery commodities to ensure that all commodities are sold out by the end of the day, or operate on a half-day schedule. Meanwhile, some vendors opt not to open their fish stalls at all amid the low demand. Regardless of the low demand, market administrators continue to implement precautionary safety measures such as wearing of face masks and face shields, and mandatory temperature checks & hand disinfections to ensure the safety of vendors and consumers against COVID-19.

Effective Nov. 14, a price freeze for selected agri-fishery commodities was implemented in selected areas in Luzon (i.e., Batangas, Cavite, Catanduanes, Mindoro, Palawan, and Camarines provinces, as well as Marikina City) relative to the declaration of State of Calamity in said areas. Following are the prices adapted under price freeze: medium-sized Bangus at Php169.00/kg, Tilapia at Php120.00/kg, Local-fresh Galunggong at Php140.00/kg, and Imported-frozen Galunggong at Php180.00/kg.</p> <p>9. However, on Nov. 26, DA Administrative Circular No. 17 was signed, setting new Suggested Retail Prices (SRP) for medium-sized Bangus, Tilapia, Imported-frozen Galunggong, and Alumahan at Php160.00/kg, Php120.00/kg, Php140.00/kg, and Php250.00/kg, respectively.</p>
