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Remarks/Market Observations:		<p><i>Note: (NS=No Submission) No price monitoring activity on the fourth week of November due to the unavailability of the enumerators who attended the Training-Workshop on Monitoring & Evaluation.</i></p> <p>*Major Source Areas of Top 3 Commodities: 1. Bangus = Bulacan, Rizal, Zambales, Batangas, and Pangasinan 2. Tilapia =Batangas 3.1 Galunggong =Palawan 3.2 Imported Galunggong = China and Vietnam</p> <p>Closed Fishing Season (CFS) Implementations: - <i>November 1, 2019 to January 31, 2020</i> : Local Galunggong in Northern Palawan, which is where 92% of the landed catch at the Navotas Fish Port and 22% of total landed catch nationwide are sourced (per JAO No. 01 series of 2015); and - <i>November 15, 2019 to February 15, 2020</i> : Sardines, Herrings (<i>Sardinella spp .</i>), and Mackerels (<i>Rastrilliger spp .</i>) in some parts of the Visayan Sea (per Fisheries Administrative Order No. 167-3 Series of 2013)</p> <p>The following observations were gathered during the actual price monitoring activities for the month of November:</p> <p>*The supply of marine fishes, including local Galunggong, continued to decrease this month. According to interviews, this is due to the low volume of catch caused by: (1) the lean season for some marine fishes (2) the occurrence of full moon last November 12, where the bright moonlight causes the marine fish to scatter and difficult to catch, (3) the aforementioned fishing bans in some major fishing grounds in the country, and (4) the recurring rain caused by consecutive typhoons such as typhoon"Quiel," and tropical storms "Ramon" and "Sarah."</p> <p>*Based on the gathered data, there is no supply of local Galunggong "lalaki "(<i>Decapterus macrosoma</i>) during the second and third week of this month while the data from the first week are from the local Galunggong sold mixed with other marine commodities such as <i>Sardinella spp .</i>, <i>Auxis spp .</i>, and <i>Decapterus Kurroides .</i>, among others.</p> <p>*The observed low supply of marine fishes resulted to a higher number of broker/traders that sell frozen/imported fishery commodities. However, there were noted feedbacks that the supply of frozen/imported Galunggong decreased at the Navotas Fish Port.</p> <p>*As for Bangus and Tilapia, the supply of the two commodities are stable this week. However, some brokers/traders are still selling their supply at a higher price as a response to the higher demand brought by the nearing of the Christmas holidays.</p> <p>*Per interviews with traders and brokers, the continuous low supply of marine commodities resulted to an increase in the demand of aquaculture commodities such as Bangus and Tilapia.</p>
