**Remarks/Market Observations:**

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of November:

- Adequate volumes of Bangus and Tilapia were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port, resulting to stable wholesale prices of the commodities for the whole month.
- Supplies of Local-fresh Galunggong at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) were influenced by:
  - heavy rains brought by Super Typhoon Rolly (Week 1), which greatly affected southern part of Luzon and Typhoon Ulysses (Week 2) which hampered fishing and transport operations;
  - occurrence of full moon or "Hunter's Moon" on October 31, 2020;
  - Closed Fishing Season (CFS) for pelagic fishes, including Galunggong, in Northeastern Palawan from Nov. 1, 2020 to Feb. 15, 2021 (Source: Philippines News Agency. Cudis, C. 13 Oct 2020, retrieved from: <https://www.pna.gov.ph/articles/1118394>.)
- On the fourth week of November, large volumes of marine commodities such as Tulingan, Dalagang Bukid, and Gulyasan were available. However, unloaded Local-Fresh Galunggong from Southern Palawan were of low quality (in terms of freshness); hence, were sold at a lower price.
- For Imported-frozen Galunggong, limited volumes of the commodity were noted at the fish port. Despite its limited availability, the commodity remains as an alternative commodity to Local-fresh Galunggong amid the local variant's high selling price and limited availability.
- Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port are sourced mainly from the following areas:  
 Commodity      Wholesale (Navotas Fish Port)  
 Bangus              Pangasinan  
 Tilapia              Batangas  
 Local Galunggong      Southern Palawan
- Vendors at Navotas Fish Port continue to experience "mahinang bentahan" or low demand of fishery commodities due to the scare brought by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to implement safety precautionary management measures against COVID-19 (i.e., wearing of face masks and face shields, mandatory temperature checks, observance of hand disinfection measures) to ensure the safety of traders and consumers at Navotas Fish Port.
