Tilapia = Batangas  3.1 Galunggong = Palawan  3.2 Imported Galunggong = China and Vietnam</p> <p>The following observations were gathered during the price monitoring activities for the month of October:  *The prevailing wholesale price of Bangus is higher this month as compared last August and September. Based on the gathered data, the prevailing price of medium-sized Bangus has been in an increasing trend from Php95.00/kg on the month of August, to Php110.00/kg last September, to Php125.00/kg this month. According to interviews, the higher wholesale price of the aforementioned commodity may be attributed to (1) the increase in demand relative to the recent issue on the "African Swine Fever" (ASF), and (2) the decrease in the supply coming from major source areas such as Pangasinan, Bulacan, and Rizal. It was also noted that the low supply may be associated with some producers extending their culture period in an effort to increase the size and value of their Bangus in preparation for the upcoming Christmas holidays.  *The supply of marine fishes, including local Galunggong, remain low this month. Per brokers/traders, this may be attributed to (1) the occurrence of fullmoon last October 14, where the bright moonlight causes the marine fish to scatter, making them difficult to catch, and (2) the lean season for some marine fishes.  *The observed low supply of marine fishes resulted to a high number of broker/traders that sell frozen/imported fishery commodities.  *It was also observed during the first week of this month that the only available local Galunggong are being sold mixed with other marine commodities such as <i>Sardinella spp.</i>, <i>Axius spp.</i>, and <i>Selar crumenophthalmus.</i>, among others.  *Meanwhile, the price of Tilapia had a Php5.00/kg decrement this month as compared to last September due to the abundant supply of the said commodity at the Navotas Fish Port.</p>
