Tilapia =Batangas</b>  <b>3.1 Galunggong =Palawan</b>  <b>3.2 Imported Galunggong = China and Vietnam</b></p> <p>The following observations were gathered during the price monitoring activities for the month of September:  *The prevailing wholesale of price of Bangus is higher this month as compared last August due to the decrease in the volume of unloading at the Navotas Fish Port. Per interviews with market vendors, the supply of Bangus started decreasing on the first week of the month and has been low since due to the lesser supply coming from Pangasinan and Bulacan, both of which are major source areas of the commodity. The low supply from major source areas may also be attributed to the postponement of harvest among some producers in an effort to increase the Bangus' size and value.  *As for local Galunggong, the supply remain low due to the low volume of unloading caused by the recurring heavy rain and strong winds brought by typhoon "Liwayway" on the first week (September 2-6) of the month and the continuous heavy monsoon rains ("Habagat"). The occurrence of full moon last September 14, where marine fishes are normally scattered and difficult to catch, and the lean season for marine fishes, particularly local Galunggong, might have also contributed to the low volume of catch.  *It was also observed that majority of the available local Galunggong being sold at the said fish port are mixed with other marine commodities such as <i>Decapterus spp.</i>, <i>Sardinella spp.</i>, <i>Rastrilliger spp.</i>, <i>Auxis spp.</i>, among others.  *There is still a large number of brokers/traders selling frozen/imported fishery commodities at the Navotas Fish Port due to the low supply of some marine fishery commodities.  *The supply of Tilapia remain stable. However, the price of the said commodity remains at Php85.00/kg, Php5.00/kg higher as compared last July.  *The demand caused by the nearing of the Christmas holidays and the recent issue on the "African Swine Fever" might have contributed to the higher wholesale price of some fishery commodities, including Bangus, Tilapia, and local Galunggong as compared to July and August.</p>
