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Glossary of Terms, Abbreviations, and Acronyms

ABC – Approved Budget for the Contract.

ARCC – Allowable Range of Contract Cost.

BAC – Bids and Awards Committee.

Bid – A signed offer or proposal to undertake a contract submitted by a bidder in response to and in consonance with the requirements of the bidding documents. Also referred to as *Proposal* and *Tender*. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[c])

Bidder – Refers to a contractor, manufacturer, supplier, distributor and/or consultant who submits a bid in response to the requirements of the Bidding Documents. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[d])

Bidding Documents – The documents issued by the Procuring Entity as the bases for bids, furnishing all information necessary for a prospective bidder to prepare a bid for the Goods, Infrastructure Projects, and/or Consulting Services required by the Procuring Entity. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[e])

BIR – Bureau of Internal Revenue.

BSP – Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas.

CDA – Cooperative Development Authority.

Consulting Services – Refer to services for Infrastructure Projects and other types of projects or activities of the GOP requiring adequate external technical and professional expertise that are beyond the capability and/or capacity of the GOP to undertake such as, but not limited to:

(i) advisory and review services; (ii) pre-investment or feasibility studies; (iii) design; (iv) construction supervision; (v) management and related services; and (vi) other technical services or special studies. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[i])

Contract – Refers to the agreement entered into between the Procuring Entity and the Supplier or Manufacturer or Distributor or Service Provider for procurement of Goods and Services; Contractor for Procurement of Infrastructure Projects; or Consultant or Consulting Firm for Procurement of Consulting Services; as the case may be, as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.

Contractor – is a natural or juridical entity whose proposal was accepted by the Procuring Entity and to whom the Contract to execute the Work was awarded. Contractor as used in these Bidding Documents may likewise refer to a supplier, distributor, manufacturer, or consultant.

CPI – Consumer Price Index.

DOLE – Department of Labor and Employment.

DTI – Department of Trade and Industry.

Foreign-funded Procurement or Foreign-Assisted Project – Refers to procurement whose funding source is from a foreign government, foreign or international financing institution as specified in the Treaty or International or Executive Agreement. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[b]).

GFI – Government Financial Institution.

GOCC – Government-owned and/or –controlled corporation.

Goods – Refer to all items, supplies, materials and general support services, except Consulting Services and Infrastructure Projects, which may be needed in the transaction of public businesses or in the pursuit of any government undertaking, project or activity, whether in the nature of equipment, furniture, stationery, materials for construction, or personal property of any kind, including non-personal or contractual services such as the repair and maintenance of equipment and furniture, as well as trucking, hauling, janitorial, security, and related or analogous services, as well as procurement of materials and supplies provided by the Procuring Entity for such services. The term “related” or “analogous services” shall include, but is not limited to, lease or purchase of office space, media advertisements, health maintenance services, and other services essential to the operation of the Procuring Entity. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[r])

GOP – Government of the Philippines.

Infrastructure Projects – Include the construction, improvement, rehabilitation, demolition, repair, restoration or maintenance of roads and bridges, railways, airports, seaports, communication facilities, civil works components of information technology projects, irrigation, flood control and drainage, water supply, sanitation, sewerage and solid waste management systems, shore protection, energy/power and electrification facilities, national buildings, school buildings, hospital buildings, and other related construction projects of the government. The Department of Agriculture - Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (DA-BFAR), through the Stimulus Fund intends to apply the sum of **One Million Nine Hundred Sixty Nine Thousand Four Hundred Forty Eight Pesos and Twenty Seven Centavos (PhP 1,969,448.27)** being the ABC to payment under the contract for **Bid Reference No. 2020-51-A (Re-bidding)** entitled **“ENGINEERING SERVICES, LABOR AND MATERIALS FOR THE REHABILITATION OF PONDS AT BFAR-NBFTC PAGBILAO, QUEZON.”**

Bids received in excess of the ABC shall be automatically rejected at bid opening.

2. The DA-BFAR now invites bids for the above Procurement Project. Completion of the Works is required (specified in GCC Clause 2). Bidders should have completed a contract similar to the Project. The description of an eligible bidder is contained in the Bidding Documents, particularly, in Section II (Instructions to Bidders).
3. Bidding will be conducted through open competitive bidding procedures using non- discretionary “pass/fail” criterion as specified in the 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184. And in accordance with the procedural guidelines under BAC Resolution No. 2020-55, attached hereto as Annex A “Adoption of Guidelines for the Electronic Submission of Bids in accordance with GPPB Resolution 09-2020”.

Bidding is restricted to Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships, partnerships, or organizations with at least sixty percent (60%) interest or outstanding capital stock belonging to citizens of the Philippines, and to citizens or organizations of a country the laws or regulations of which grant similar rights or privileges to Filipino citizens, pursuant to RA No. 5183.

4. Prospective Bidders may obtain further information from the BFAR BAC Secretariat through electronic mailing address given below, and inspect of the Bidding Documents at www.bfar.da.gov.ph.
5. A complete set of Bidding Documents may be acquired by interested Bidders at **3rd Floor, BAC Office, Elliptical Road, Diliman, Quezon City and/or through electronic means** and upon payment of a non-refundable fee for the Bidding Documents in the amount stated above. The Procuring Entity shall allow the bidder to present its proof of payment for the fees by in person, or through electronic means.
6. The DA-BFAR will hold a Pre-Bid Conference¹ through a video conference call using Zoom application on **February 23, 2021 (Tuesday), 10:00 A.M.** which shall be open to prospective bidders who have successfully completed registration one (1) calendar day prior to the pre-bid conference using Google Form which can be accessed here: <https://forms.gle/9PassK7oCipk8iXD6>
7. Bids must be duly received by the BAC Secretariat through electronic submission in accordance with the BFAR BAC procedure for online bidding stated in Annex A simultaneously with the submission of the printed copies as indicated in the BDS Clause 15. The deadline of manual submission and receipt of bids is on **March 8, 2021 (Monday), 9:30 A.M.** at the BFAR-BAC Office, 3rd flr., PCA Main Bldg., Elliptical Road, Diliman, Q.C; while the electronic documents shall be submitted at the bac.eps@bfar.da.gov.ph
8. All bids must be accompanied by a bid security in any of the acceptable forms and in the amount stated in **ITB** Clause 15.
9. Bid opening shall be held through a video conference call using Zoom application on **March 8, 2021 (Monday), 10:00 A.M.** Bids will be opened in accordance with the BFAR BAC procedure for online bidding stated in Annex A. Late bids shall not be accepted.
10. Bidders are advised to submit their bids in accordance with the BFAR BAC procedure for online bidding as well as for the printed copies as provided under ITB Clause 10 and Clause 11.
11. The DA-BFAR reserves the right to reject any and all bids, declare a failure of bidding, or not award the contract at any time prior to contract award in accordance with Sections 35.6 and 41 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders.

Section II. Instructions to Bidders

1. Scope of Bid

The DA-BFAR wishes to receive Bids for the **“ENGINEERING SERVICES, LABOR AND FOR THE REHABILITATION OF PONDS AT BFAR-NBFTC PAGBILAO, QUEZON.”** with identification number **2020-51-A (Re-bidding)**.

The Procurement Project (referred to herein as “Project”) is composed of One (1) Lot, the details of which are described in Section VII (Technical Specifications).

2. Funding Information

2.1. The GOP through the source of funding as indicated below for FY 2020 in the amount of **One Million Nine Hundred Sixty Nine Thousand Four Hundred Forty Eight Pesos and Twenty Seven Centavos (PhP 1,969,448.27)**.

2.2. The source of funding is under “Bayanihan to Recover as One Act”. (Available for release, obligation and disbursement not later than June 30, 2021 as per DBM-NBC circular no. 585 dated January 26, 2021.

3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manual and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

Any amendments made to the IRR and other GPPB issuances shall be applicable only to the ongoing posting, advertisement, or invitation to bid by the BAC through the issuance of a supplemental or bid bulletin.

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have inspected the site, determined the general characteristics of the contracted Works and the conditions

for this Project, such as the location and the nature of the work; (b) climatic conditions; (c) transportation facilities; (c) nature and condition of the terrain, geological conditions at the site communication facilities, requirements, location and availability of construction aggregates and other materials, labor, water, electric power and access roads; and (d) other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

4. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, Coercive, and Obstructive Practices

The Procuring Entity, as well as the Bidders and Contractors, shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. They or through an agent shall not engage in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices defined under Annex “I” of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or other integrity violations in competing for the Project.

5. Eligible Bidders

- 5.1. Only Bids of Bidders found to be legally, technically, and financially capable will be evaluated.
- 5.2. The Bidder must have an experience of having completed a Single Largest Completed Contract (SLCC) that is similar to this Project, equivalent to at least fifty percent (50%) of the ABC adjusted, if necessary, by the Bidder to current prices using the PSA’s CPI, except under conditions provided for in Section 23.4.2.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

A contract is considered to be “similar” to the contract to be bid if it has the major categories of work stated in the **BDS**.

- 5.3. For Foreign-funded Procurement, the Procuring Entity and the foreign government/foreign or international financing institution may agree on another track record requirement, as specified in the Bidding Document prepared for this purpose.
- 5.4. The Bidders shall comply with the eligibility criteria under Section 23.4.2 of the 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.

6. Origin of Associated Goods

There is no restriction on the origin of Goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the UN Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the UN.

7. Subcontracts

- 7.1. The Bidder may subcontract portions of the Project to the extent allowed by the Procuring Entity as stated herein, but in no case more than fifty percent (50%) of the Project.

The Procuring Entity has prescribed that:

- a. Subcontracting is allowed. The portions of Project and the maximum percentage allowed to be subcontracted are indicated in the **BDS**, which shall not exceed fifty percent (50%) of the contracted Works.
- 7.1. The Bidder must submit together with its Bid the documentary requirements of the subcontractor(s) complying with the eligibility criterion stated in **ITB** Clause 5 in accordance with Section 23.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 pursuant to Section 23.1 thereof.
- 7.2. The Supplier may identify its subcontractor during the contract implementation stage. Subcontractors identified during the bidding may be changed during the implementation of this Contract. Subcontractors must submit the documentary requirements under Section 23.1 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 and comply with the eligibility criteria specified in **ITB** Clause 5 to the implementing or end-user unit.
- 7.3. Subcontracting of any portion of the Project does not relieve the Contractor of any liability or obligation under the Contract. The Supplier will be responsible for the acts, defaults, and negligence of any subcontractor, its agents, servants, or workmen as fully as if these were the Contractor's own acts, defaults, or negligence, or those of its agents, servants, or workmen.

8. Pre-Bid Conference

The Procuring Entity will hold a pre-bid conference for this Project through a video conference call using Zoom application on **February 23, 2021 (Tuesday), 10:00 A.M.** which shall be open to prospective bidders who have successfully completed registration one (1) calendar day prior to the pre-bid conference using Google Form as indicated in paragraph 6 of the **IB**.

9. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and received by the Procuring Entity, either at its given address or through electronic mail indicated in the **IB**, at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.

10. Documents Comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 10.1. The first envelope shall contain the eligibility and technical documents of the Bid as specified in **Section IX. Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents**.

- 10.2. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents for submission to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation in English, which shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment, post, or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. For Contracting Parties to the Apostille Convention, only the translated documents shall be authenticated through an apostille pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019 dated 23 May 2019. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.
- 10.3. A valid PCAB License is required, and in case of joint ventures, a valid special PCAB License, and registration for the type and cost of the contract for this Project. Any additional type of Contractor license or permit shall be indicated in the **BDS**.
- 10.4. A List of Contractor's key personnel (e.g., Project Manager, Project Engineers, Materials Engineers, and Foremen) assigned to the contract to be bid, with their complete qualification and experience data shall be provided. These key personnel must meet the required minimum years of experience set in the **BDS**.
- 10.5. A List of Contractor's major equipment units, which are owned, leased, and/or under purchase agreements, supported by proof of ownership, certification of availability of equipment from the equipment lessor/vendor for the duration of the project, as the case may be, must meet the minimum requirements for the contract set in the **BDS**.

11. Documents Comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in **Section IX. Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents**.
- 11.2. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in paragraph 1 of the **IB** shall not be accepted.
- 11.3. For Foreign-funded procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the conditions are met under Section 31.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

12. Alternative Bids

Bidders shall submit offers that comply with the requirements of the Bidding Documents, including the basic technical design as indicated in the drawings and specifications. Unless there is a value engineering clause in the **BDS**, alternative Bids shall not be accepted.

13. Bid Prices

All bid prices for the given scope of work in the Project as awarded shall be considered as fixed prices, and therefore not subject to price escalation during contract implementation, except under extraordinary circumstances as determined by the NEDA and approved by the GPPB pursuant to the revised Guidelines for Contract Price Escalation guidelines.

14. Bid and Payment Currencies

14.1. Bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradeable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.

14.2. Payment of the contract price shall be made in Philippine Pesos.

15. Bid Security

15.1. The Bidder shall submit a Bid Securing Declaration or any form of Bid Security in the amount indicated in the **BDS**, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the schedule in the **BDS**.

15.2. The Bid and bid security shall be valid until **July 06, 2021**. Any bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.

16. Sealing and Marking of Bids

Each Bidder shall submit one (1) original and two (2) printed copies of the first and second components of its Bid and an electronic copy which must be digitally signed. In the event that the electronic copy cannot be submitted, opened or is corrupted, the BAC will proceed with the opening of the submitted original hard copy.

17. Deadline for Submission of Bids

The Bidder shall submit bids on or before **March 8, 2021 (Monday), 9:30 A.M.** at the BFAR-BAC Office, 3rd flr., PCA Main Bldg., Elliptical Road, Diliman, Q.C., and **bac.eps@bfar.da.gov.ph** as indicated in paragraph 7 of the IB.

18. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids

- 18.1. The BAC shall open the Bids on **March 8, 2021 (Monday), 10:00 A.M** via video conference through “Zoom” application. Bids will be opened in accordance with the BFAR BAC procedure for online bidding as stated in the “Bidder’s kit VII” as specified in paragraph 9 of the IB.

In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the rescheduling requirements under Section 29 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall prevail.

- 18.2. The preliminary examination of Bids shall be governed by Section 30 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

- 19.1. The Procuring Entity’s BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated “*passed*” using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

- 19.2. If the Project allows partial bids, all Bids and combinations of Bids as indicated in the **BDS** shall be received by the same deadline and opened and evaluated simultaneously so as to determine the Bid or combination of Bids offering the lowest calculated cost to the Procuring Entity. Bid Security as required by **ITB** Clause 16 shall be submitted for each contract (lot) separately.

- 19.3. In all cases, the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.2.6 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots participated in by the prospective Bidder.

20. Post Qualification

Within a non-extendible period of five (5) calendar days from receipt by the Bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest Calculated Bid, the Bidder shall submit its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS), and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the **BDS**.

21. Signing of the Contract

The documents required in Section 37.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall form part of the Contract. Additional Contract documents are indicated in the **BDS**.

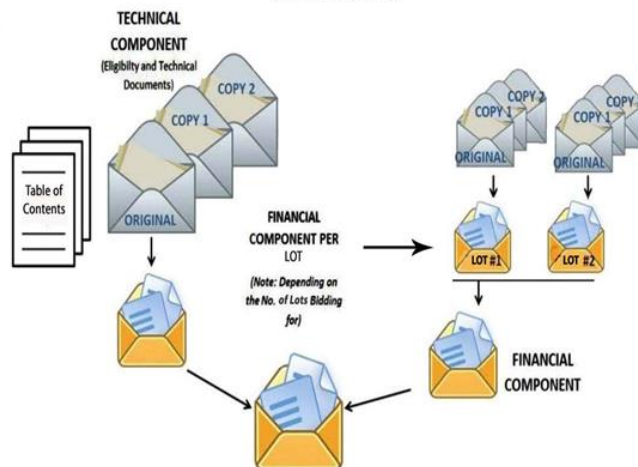

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Section IV. General Conditions of Contract

1. Scope of Contract

This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. All the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including the Generic Procurement Manual, and associated issuances, constitute the primary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract, and thus, applicable in contract implementation. Herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract.

This is without prejudice to Sections 74.1 and 74.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 allowing the GPPB to amend the IRR, which shall be applied to all procurement activities, the advertisement, posting, or invitation of which were issued after the effectivity of the said amendment.

2. Sectional Completion of Works

TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. BACKGROUND

The BFAR National Brackishwater Fisheries Technology Center (NBFTC) in Pagbilao, Quezon was established in 1978 as the site for the production of brackishwater species particularly milkfish and tiger prawn. In 1986, it expanded its scope to other saltwater species such as grouper, siganid, spotted scat, seabass, mangrove snapper, salt-tolerant tilapia and mudcrab. At present, the BFAR-NBFTC focuses on the development and production of mud crab and oyster.

From the time when BFAR-NBFTC was constructed four decades ago, no major rehabilitation was done to pond facilities, except for the periodic pond repair and maintenance. In spite of the repair and maintenance, most of the pond dikes have eroded due to constant exposure to wind and water. Moreover, the Center is located where typhoons crossed over frequently, mostly during the third and fourth quarter of the year. Strong typhoons coinciding with high spring tides caused flashfloods that reached half-meter from the ground, and in some instances caused damage to perimeter dikes. There is a need, therefore, to repair and strengthen the pond dikes at BFAR-NBFTC. The rehabilitation of the pond facilities will help increase the survival rate of the stock and the productivity of the pond area.

Finally, there is a need to construct a light or hanging bridge that would link Phase 2 site to the rest of the DA-BFAR NBFTC areas. This investment will enable unrestricted access to the Phase 2 site, regardless of weather and tidal conditions. The first step to for this project is a detailed engineering design with corresponding tests of soil and other technical parameters.

2. OBJECTIVE

The project aims to rehabilitate the pond facilities of BFAR-NBFTC, specifically:

- A. To restore dike slopes and increase height of dikes and accordingly strengthen by a combination of back-filling and staking; in the following pond compartments and dikes:

- i. Reservoir, Phase 3 Area
 - ii. Housing perimeter dike
 - iii. Water way, Phase 1 Area
 - iv. Main water canal, Phase 1 Area
 - v. Rearing Pond (RP) – 3, Phase 1 Area
 - vi. RP-2, Phase 1 Area;
 - vii. RP-1, Phase 2 Area;
 - viii. Nursery ponds, Phase 1 Area; and
 - ix. Rearing ponds 1-A and 1-B, Phase 2 Area.
- B. To excavate and achieve desired depth over shallow portions of the above-listed ponds.
 - C. control infestation of dike borrowing *Thallasina* spp., and other burrowing crustaceans by inserting by packing o “mitsahan” of HDPE liner (which also prevents seepage) and application of benign agri-chemicals (i.e. calcium oxide and ammonium sulfate);
 - D. Purchase pond modern pond aeration systems, namely roots blower and air-diffusers for pond operations.

3. SCOPE OF WORK AND DETAILS

A. This project is composed of the following works/services and goods:

- i. **Engineering services**

- Provision and supervision of labor for the pond rehabilitation works.

ENGINEERING SERVICES: PROVISION AND SUPERVISION OF LABOR

1. Deploy local skilled pond workers, per existing sub-contracting GPPB rules for infrastructure type of projects (i.e. 50% of total cost);
2. The volume of earth to be moved for dike filing and/or pond bottom excavation per identified/priority sections as determined by DA-BFAR NBFTC shall serve as the minimum basis work (see Annex 1, Items 1 to 12 and Annex 2. Tabulated summary of pond rehab works, for details). DA-NBFTC estimated a total of 4,561 cubic meters of pond soil will be moved in the pond rehab works.
3. Pond and dike rehabilitation pertains to attaining the prescribed dimensions (i.e. height, slope, base and berms) of the specified portions of pond in Annex 1 and 2.
4. Dike rehab activities includes:
 - a) site preparation using markers and stakes;
 - b) earth packing/sealing of damaged portions or “pag-titilas”, in addition;

 - a) Pag-babalat", "Pag-titilas" at "Pag-iistaka" as package of work (measured/computed based on cubic meters of soil); and
 - b) "Pag-mimitsa" (measured in linear meters dike);
6. Noting further that cubic meters of soil in Item No 5, Letter A are not accounted separately. As such, "Pag-balalat" is a required process or step in "Pag-iistaka" or "Pag-titilas". 7. The volume of soil dug-out in the process of "Pag-mimitsa" is not considered or evaluated per cubic meter, since this step is necessary to effectively lay the HDPE liner in vertical position;
8. Application of agri-chemicals (i.e. calcium oxide and ammonium sulfate) will be done by DA-BFAR NBFTC staff;
9. Accounting and evaluation of completed works shall be made on daily basis.

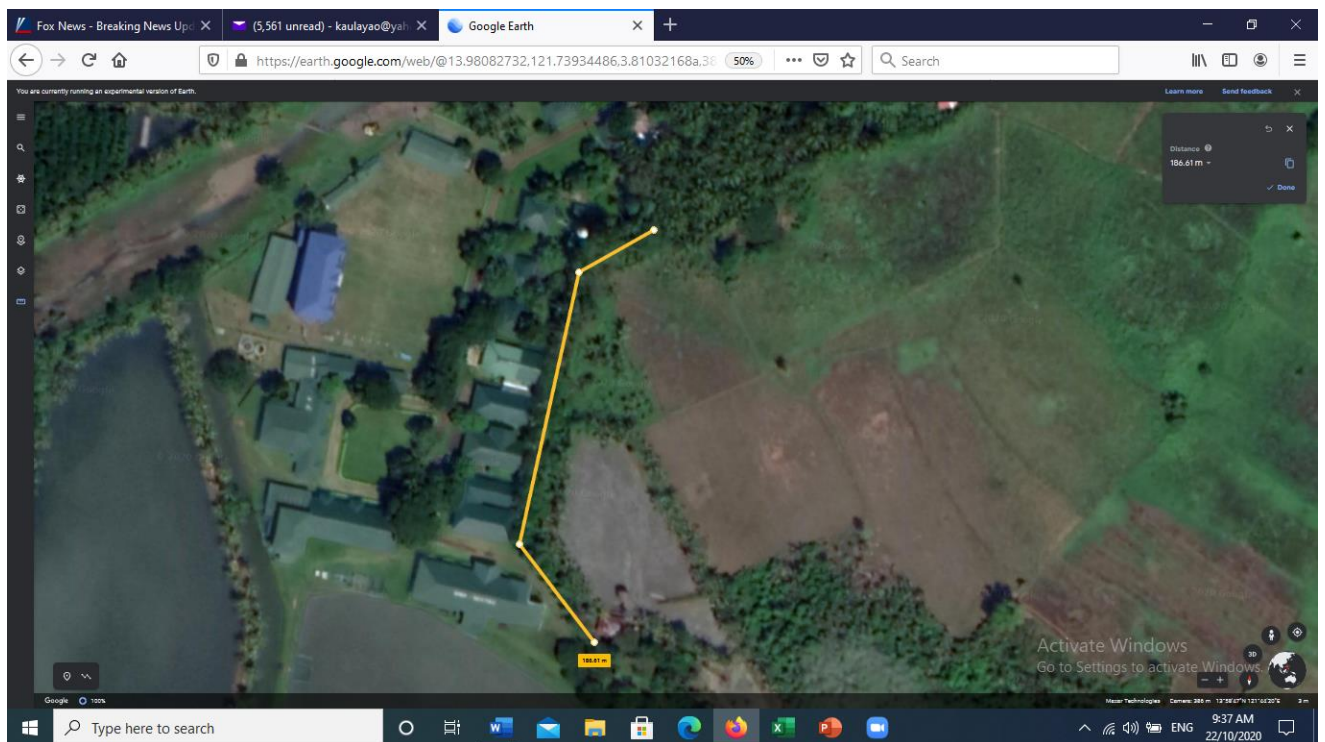
Item 1. Phase 3 Reservoir, Section 1



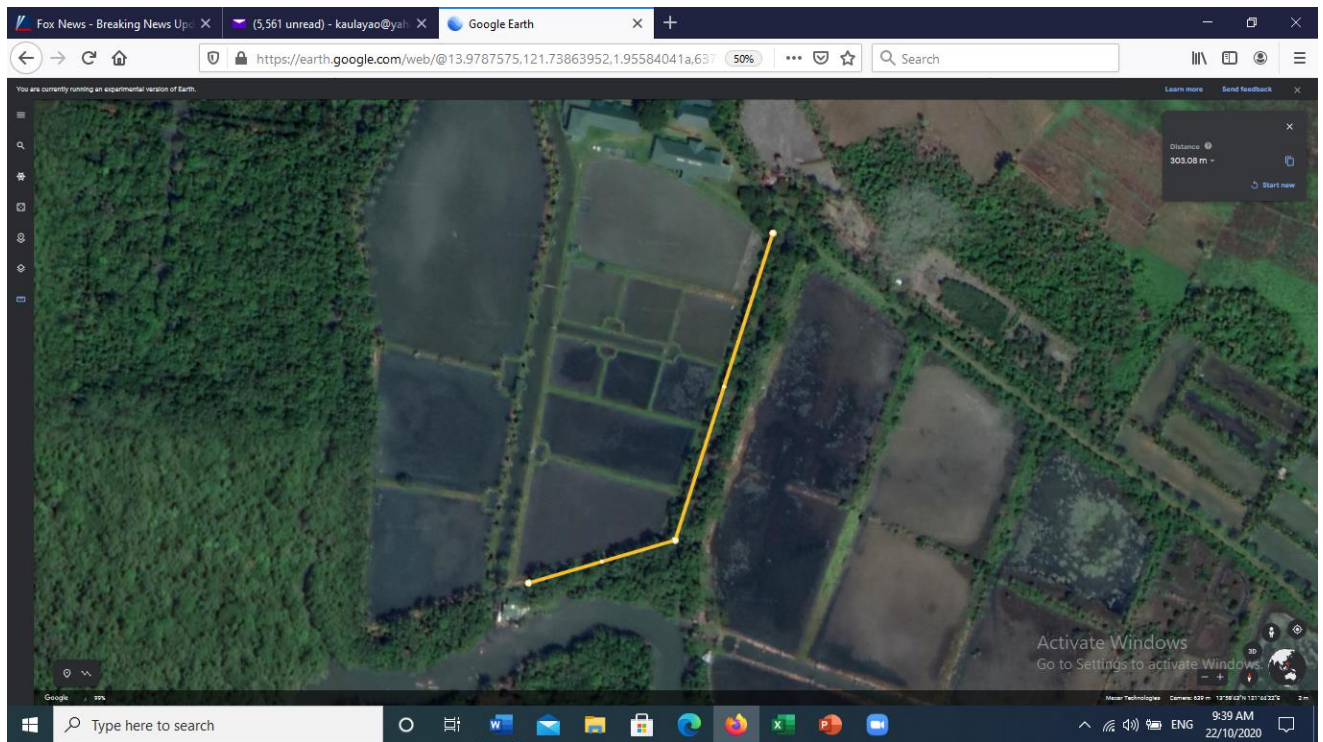
Item 1. Phase 3 Reservoir, Section 2



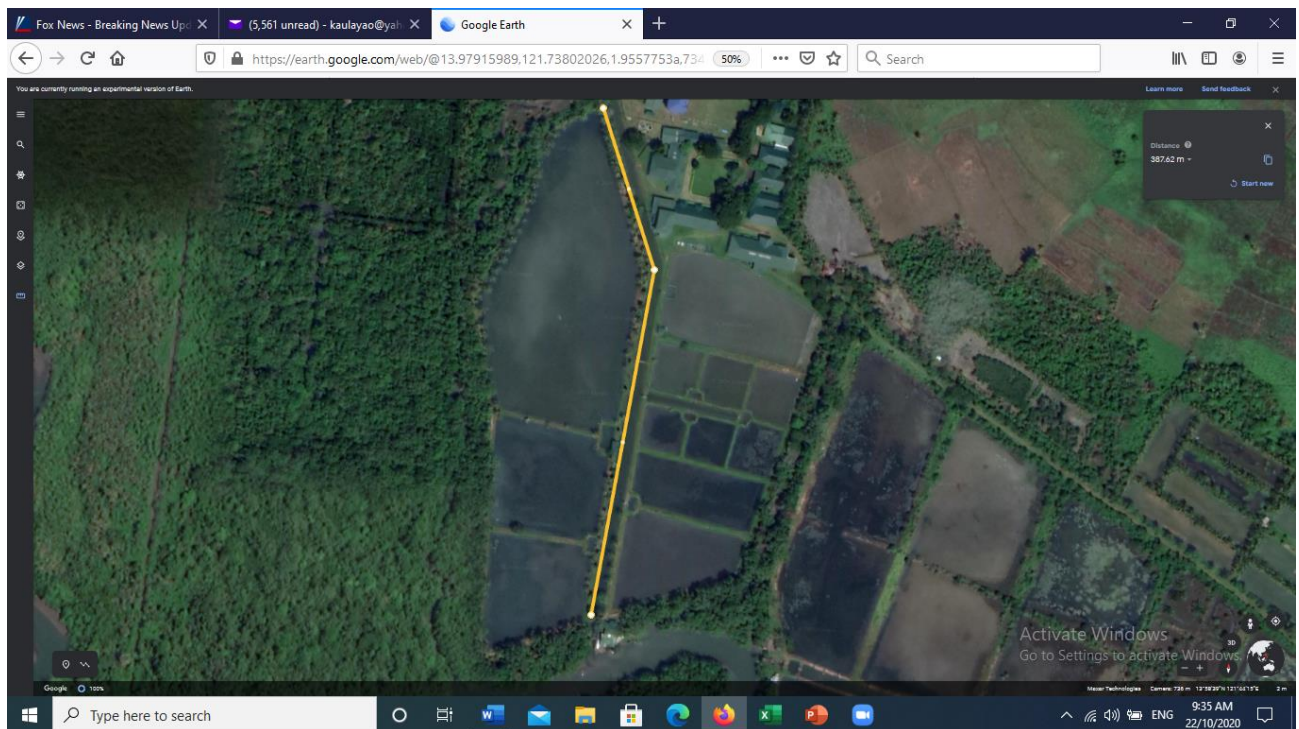

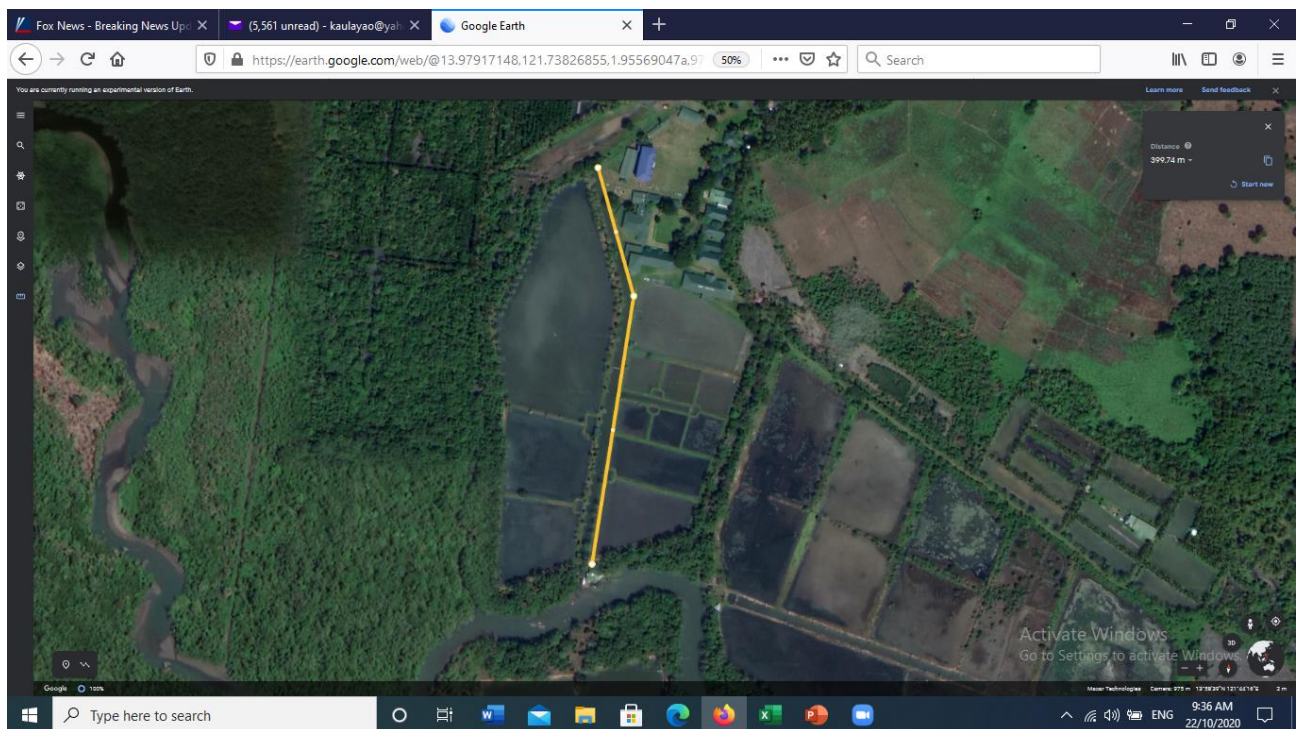
Item 2. Housing Perimeter dike



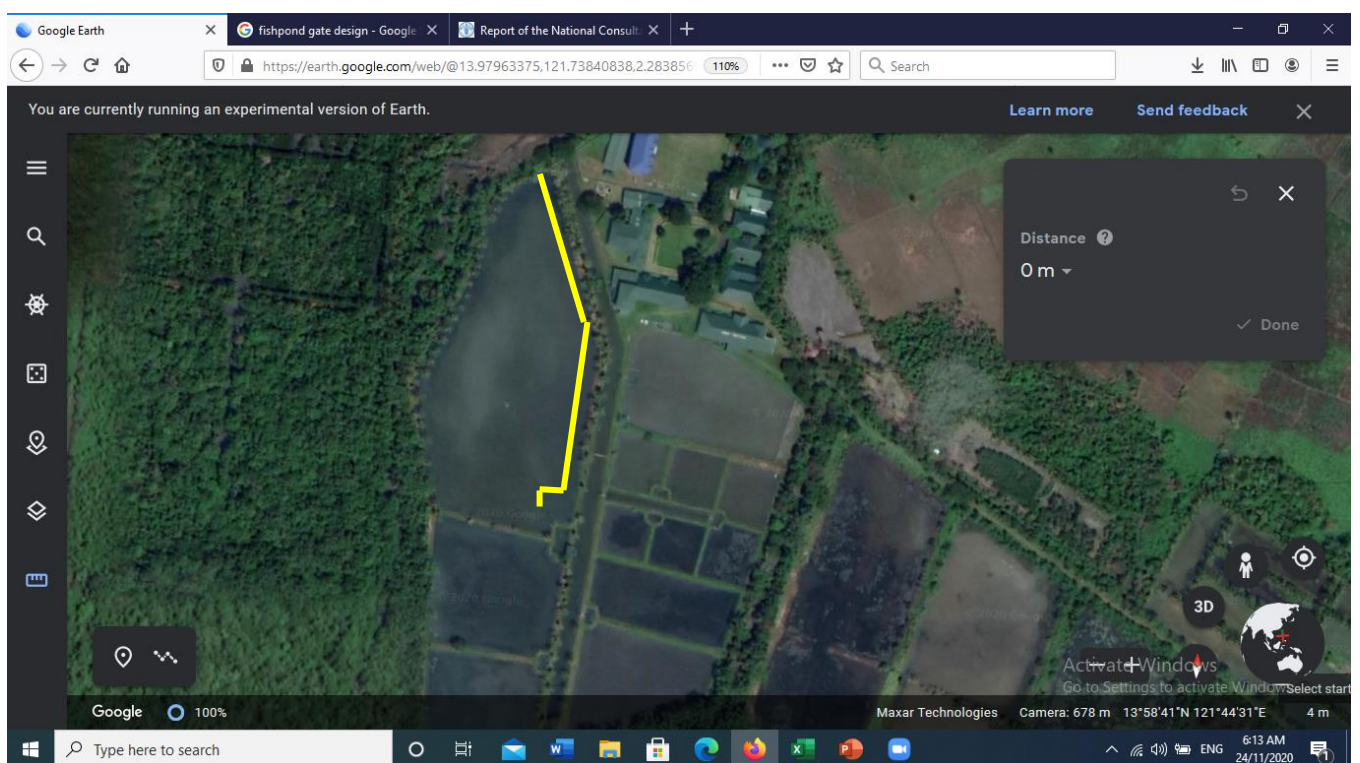
Item 3. Phase 1 Waterway along Ramos Farm



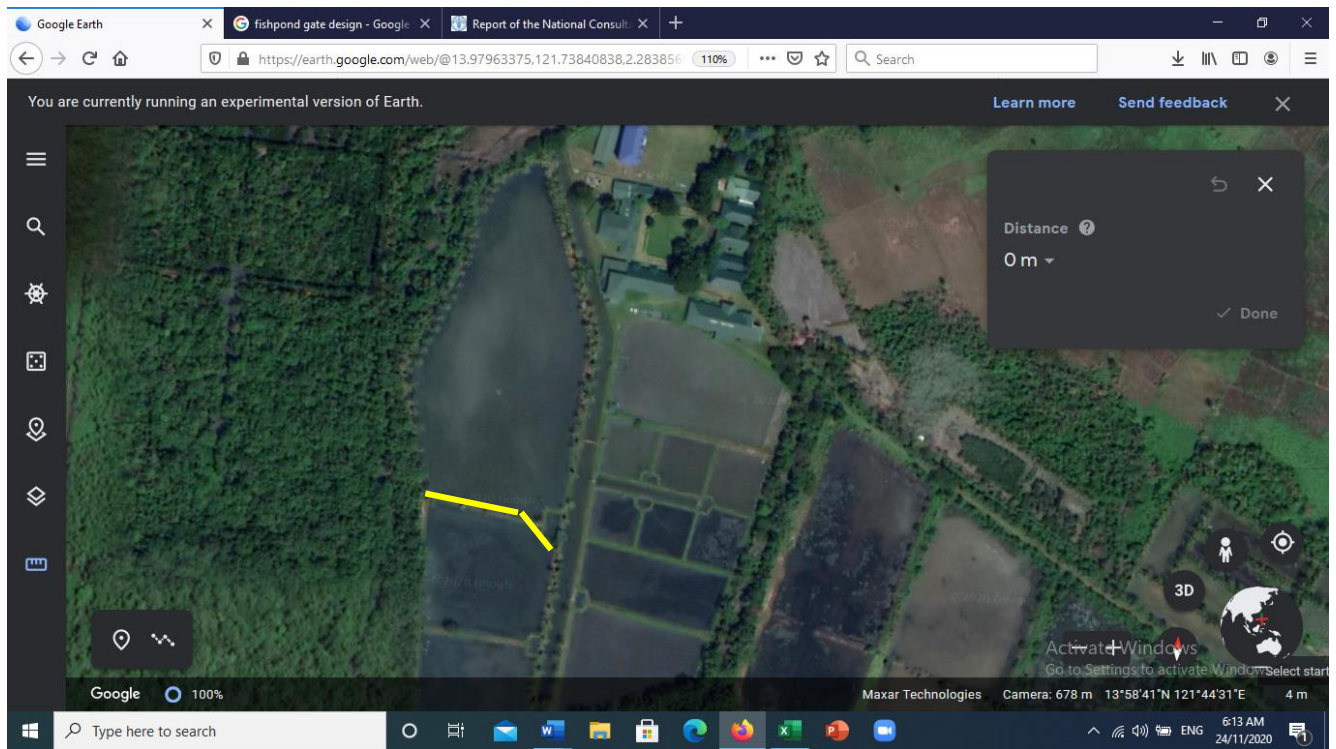

BIDDER’S KIT FOR BFAR PROCUREMENT GUIDELINES IN ADOPTING ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION OF BIDS

(GPPB Resolution No. 09-2020)

I. PRE-REGISTRATION& PRE-BID CONFERENCE

Step 1: Register by completing the information required in the **Google Form** which can be accessed here: <https://forms.gle/9PassK7oCipk8iXD6>

Once completed, submit the form to the Secretariat and wait for an acknowledgement by e-mail.

Step 2: Join the scheduled Pre-Bid Conference by clicking the link provided by the Secretariat through e-mail using **Zoom**. Please make sure that you allow access to the microphone and the camera.

Step 3: Kindly wait for the Secretariat to confirm your entry through Zoom to participate in the pre-bid conference.

Step 4: See attached file as “Annex A” for the House Rules to be observed during the conduct of procurement activities.

II. PREPARATION OF BID (SOFT COPY)

Step 1: Prepare a final scanned copy of your Bid which is divided into two different PDF files:

1. Eligibility Documents & Technical Documents; and
2. Financial Documents

Step 2: Set a password for the scanned copy of the Eligibility Documents & Technical Documents and Financial Documents and save as a .PDF file.

Step 3: Compress the file, save the password-protected .PDF file to a ZIP file. Set another password on the ZIP file.

Important: Passwords must be 8-16 characters and contain both numbers and letters/special characters. The bidder is required setting a unique combination for each file and folder. Same passwords for all files are not allowed. For details on how to set passwords in .PDF file and ZIP file, please see file attached as “Annex B”.

It may also be downloaded free of charge from the website of the Philippine Government Electronic Procurement System (PhilGEPS) and the website of the Procuring Entity, provided that Bidders shall pay the applicable fee for the Bidding Documents not later than the submission of their bids.

Step 2: The BAC Secretariat will send another Google Form link to the bidder, who already purchased the bidding documents, through the given email directing to the “Online Submission of the Bid”.

IV. ACCESSING THE GOOGLE FORMS

Step 1: Upon successful login to your email address account. You will now open the Google Form link sent through BAC Secretariat’s e-mail address given above.

Step 2: Click the **FILL OUT FORM** button. *(See attached “Annex C”)*

V. SUBMISSION OF BID

Step 1: Submit your Bids through Google Form at any time before the closing date and time specified in the Bidding Documents.

Step 2: Upon preparation and finalization of the compressed and password-protected files Eligibility & Technical and Financial Documents, a Google Form link will direct you to the page where they can now upload the said requirements. *(See attached “Annex C, Figure 10.1”)*

Step 3: After submission, a copy of the response will be automatically emailed to the address provided by you which can be saved or printed, as proof of the official time of the submission and receipt of bids. *(See attached “Annex C, Figure 11.2”)*

VI. RECEIVING OF THE SUBMITTED BID

The BAC Secretariat will receive the submitted information through Google Forms and will generate a Bid Receipt page for the official time of submission of all bidders, which can be saved or printed.

Bidders may modify their Bid at any time before the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids. Bidders shall send another Bid equally secured, properly identified, and labelled as a **“modification”** of the previously submitted. The time indicated in the latest Bid receipt page generated shall be the official time of submission. Bids submitted after the deadline shall not be accepted.

The BAC Secretariat will not be able to access the documents until the day of the Bid Opening.

VII. BID OPENING PROCESS

The BAC, with the assistance of the Secretariat and Technical Working Group (TWG), shall conduct bid opening via Zoom. Bidders are encouraged to attend the bid opening online. The passwords for the folders (ZIP) and the files (.PDF) shall be disclosed by the bidders only during actual bid opening which may be done via Zoom.

The Secretariat will ask the bidder, who choose to attend via Zoom, the corresponding password of their Bid during the bid opening itself. The official representative of the bidder shall respond promptly in the same chat box with the passwords when prompted. Bidders are given within five (5) minutes to respond with the passwords. If the bidder does not provide or respond with the password within five (5) minutes, from prompting, it will result in disqualification and the BAC shall move on to the next bid, if any.

The bidder shall first disclose the password for the compressed folder (ZIP file) containing the Eligibility & Technical documents, second disclose the password for the Eligibility & Technical document (.PDF file). The Secretariat will share the screen via Zoom during accessing the submitted Bid.

If the bidder **passed** the Eligibility & Technical requirements, the second password-protected compressed folder containing the Financial Documents and the files contained therein shall be opened in the same manner as the password of the eligibility documents as described above. In no case will a bidder disclose the passwords for the financial folder and the files prior to being declared eligible based on the evaluation of the eligibility documents.

The bidder is given only three (3) attempts to disclose the password per compressed folder (ZIP) and .PDF file to open the documents. If the bidder fails to provide the correct password after the third attempt, their Bid will no longer be considered. The Secretariat shall take and print a screenshot of such inquiries and responses to form part of the records and all incidents should be recorded in the minutes.

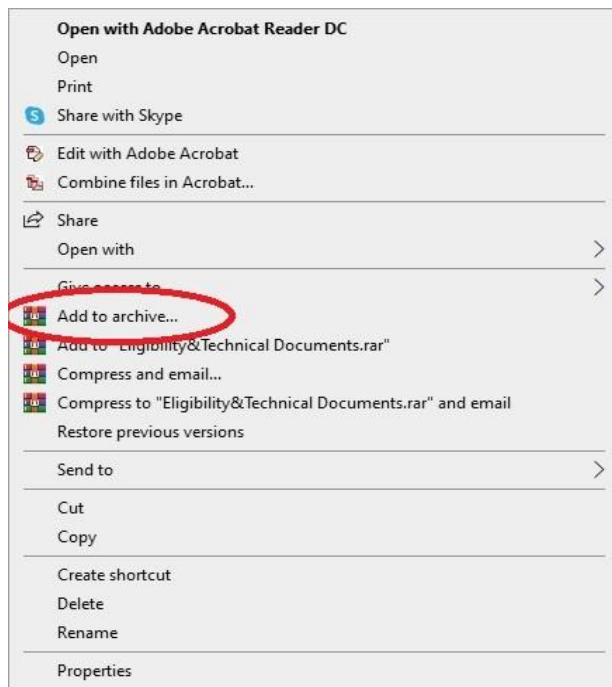

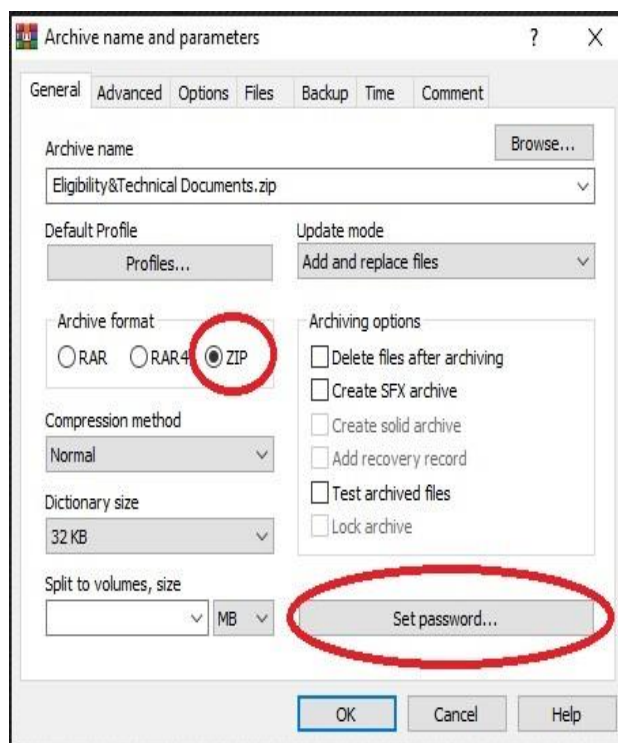



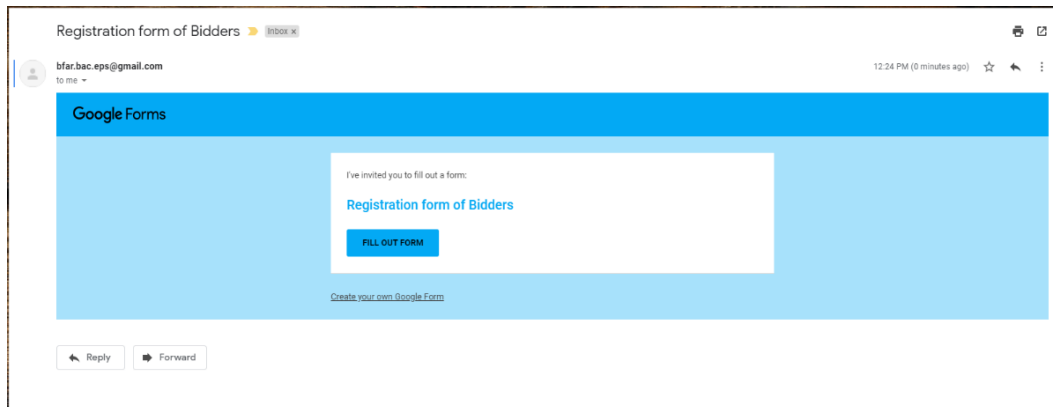
