Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Generally, lower but sufficient unloadings of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week due to the occurrence of full moon. More specifically, for medium-sized Local-fresh Galunggong Lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), only one (1) company unloaded the said commodity on June 22 priced at Php130.00/kg from Northern Palawan and only two (2) company on June 25 price at Php140.00/kg source from Zambales.
- Similarly, lesser availability of Imported-frozen Galunggong Lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) and female variant (*Decapterus russelli*) were observed this week at the fish port.
- Meanwhile, wholesale prices of Bangus and Tilapia remain stable due to its steady supply and demand. Most supplies of Bangus from Pangasinan were reportedly bigger in size at 2-3 pcs/kg.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- NA
 - Imported galunggong - NA
- Precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask and face shields as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.
