Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Generally, sufficient unloadings of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. More specifically, for medium-sized Local-fresh Galunggong Lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), unloaded supply were source mainly from Palawan.
- In relation, as the local-fresh variant of galunggong remained available at the Fish Port. Lesser availability of Imported-frozen Galunggong Lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was noted on July 13 and female variant (*Decapterus russelli*) on July 15.
- For bangus, the prevailing wholesale price were recorded at Php130.00/kg this week source mainly from Pangasinan and Bulacan. Most of the supplies of Bangus from Pangasinan were reportedly bigger in size at 2-3 pcs/kg.
- Meanwhile, as the supply and demand remained steady at the Fish Port the prevailing wholesale price of tilapia were sustained at Php85.00/kg and Php90.00/kg this week.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- NA
 - Imported galunggong - China
- Precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask and face shields as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.
