Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

1. More volumes of supplies for fresh marine commodities were noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week as compared from previous weeks where volume of unloaded supplies were limited due to the bad weather condition brought by typhoons. Among the commodities abundant were Galunggong, Gulyasan, Tulingan, Tamban, Turay, Labahita, Dalagang bukid, Dilis, Bisugo, and Lumot.
2. Supplies of Local-fresh Galunggong was sufficient at the Navotas Fish Port this week. Galunggong "Balsa" (*Decapterus macarellus*) was observed to have an abundant supply at the fish port. The actual wholesale price of local-fresh galunggong "Lalaki" (*Decapterus macrosoma*) is at Php120.00/kg-Php1450.00/kg.
2. Despite the sufficient supplies of Local-fresh Galunggong, Imported-frozen Galunggong "lalaki" continue to be available at the Navotas Fish Port this week. Some vendors prefer selling Imported-frozen Galunggong due to its low price making it easier for them to sell.
3. Both prevailing wholesale prices of Bangus and Tilapia have remained stable due to the sufficient supplies at the Navotas Fish Port.
4. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - a. Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - b. Tilapia - Batangas
 - c. Local galunggong- Palawan
 - d. Imported galunggong - China
5. Precautionary measures against COVID-19 (i.e., mandatory wearing of face masks and face shields, as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.
